Brief Summary of March Meeting Minutes

Guest Speaker: Greg Pensinger, Downtown Streets Team. This group helps the homeless get off the streets and be part of a larger team to transition back into the workforce. The local neighborhoods benefit from DST's work with cleaner areas and members also organize community service projects.

SNAIL Secretary Election: Ali Stephens was unanimously elected as Secretary.

New Block Representative: Steven Moore is the new block rep for the condos on N. Fair Oaks Ave.

Cinco de Mayo Party: Saturday, May 2nd at Columbia Park. Eric is the Leader. Funding was approved.

SNAIL Yard Sale Update: Valérie suggested switching to a more permanent sign for neighborhood activities. She, Tarik and Kirsten designed a demo A-frame sign made from PVC pipe with donated fabric and cut-out lettering that can be used for a variety of events. Costs were discussed.

SNAIL Yard Sale Newsletter Advertising: Color vs. black and white was discussed for the advertising. Final decision will be made in April.

TV Reception Status



On Feb. 23rd, five neighbors from the streets around Pine Ave. (SRPEQN), met with the City Manager and staff regarding many issues related to the buildings at 505 N. Mathilda Ave. ("LinkedIn" or now "Apple" buildings). One of the issues was the loss of reliable

over-the-air TV reception since the steel frames of these buildings were erected in June of 2013. We had asked the City to investigate if our over-the-air TV reception could be restored to the way it was before and, if not, for restoration of basic service via cable TV or similar service. The City explored the interference issue with radio frequency engineering experts who found it was very difficult to remedy the situation (and could create additional problems). The City declined our request to provide reimbursement for cable services to restore our TV programming to what it was before. This means that the City expects affected residents to either accept bad TV reception or pay for services like cable. As of this writing, SRPEQN has not yet met to decide how to respond to the City's latest response. If you would like to contact us about TV reception, please send an email to:




