Brief Summary of August Meeting Minutes

Announcements:

*Sep 12th thru 13th is the Sunnyvale Citywide Yard Sale. You may sign up online by searching 'Sunnyvale Citywide Yard Sale 2015' and click on 'register'. The registration deadline is Aug 24th. The City will advertise your yard sale for free.

*There is a Planning Commission Hearing on Mon, Aug 24th at 8pm in the Council Chambers at City Hall, 456 W. Olive Ave regarding a pending project on the corner of Maude/Morse. This involves the demolition of eight existing multi-family units and the new construction of 11 three-story townhome units within two buildings. A design review and variance will be discussed. Final action on this matter may be taken at this meeting. SNAIL committee meetings are planned prior to the hearing to write a petition to delay the final decision until the study is done. Any neighbor wishing to participate is welcome to attend these meetings.

National Night Out: Sharon McKnight reported on NNO. The cost of this event will be covered by our 2015 grant. It's estimated that about 200 people attended this event on Aug 4th.

20th Anniversary Party: Connie Cook-Turner reported on the plans for the Party. At 10:45am the chairs will be delivered. By 11:00am the set up will begin. There are restrooms on site.

Energy Competition: John Cordes informed everyone that Sunnyvale is competing for a \$5 million dollar prize for the city that reduces its residential energy usage the most. This competition is being run by Georgetown University.

City Development Plans: John Cordes stated plans have been filed for a six-story office at the corner of Pastoria/Maude. Sep speaker will discuss plans for a six-story Hilton Garden Inn on the west side of Mathilda Ave, near San Aleso at 767 N. Mathilda.

Patriot Day is a day the U.S. remembers the terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001. This day is commonly referred to as "9-11" ("Nine-Eleven"). It is believed that 2,977 people died in the attacks. President George W. Bush proclaimed September 11th Patriot Day in 2002.

Facts about Patriot Day

- On September 11th, U.S. Flags should be flown at half-mast, both on U.S. soil and abroad.
- A moment of silence is held at 8:46 a.m. (EST) across the nation commemorating the time the first plane struck the North Tower of the World Trade Center on September 11, 2001.
- The National 9/11 Memorial and Museum takes up over half of the destroyed World Trade Center site. It contains bronze parapets inscribed with the names of those killed on September 11, 2001 and those killed in the 1993 World Trade Center attack. <u>http://www.911memorial.org/</u>
- Cleaning up Ground Zero, as the World Trade Center was renamed, took 18 months and 19 days and was completed in May of 2002.
- The Twin Towers of the World Trade Center were once the tallest buildings in the world and contained enough concrete to build a sidewalk from New York City to Washington D.C.
