Standing rules are easier to change than our bylaws, but will help us document and agree on how we normally do things like elections, newsletter editor duties and other important responsibilities that are not in our bylaws.

Cold Winter Shelter Call for SNAIL Volunteers

I'm excited to announce that there will be a Sunnyvale shelter in place this winter season! The new modular buildings will be located at the old Onizuka site at 237 and Mathilda, near the Fire Station. The capacity will be 100-125 people per night. As in past seasons, the Cold Winter Shelter will open the Monday following Thanksgiving through March 31st. In the past, 8-10 SNAIL volunteers have served food and distributed bedding linen and blankets from 6 to 8pm, once a week. The schedule is set for SNAIL to help on the following evenings:

- December 2nd, 9th, 23rd and 30th
- January 6th, 13th and 27th
- February 3rd, 10th and 24th
- March 2nd, 9th, 23rd and 30th

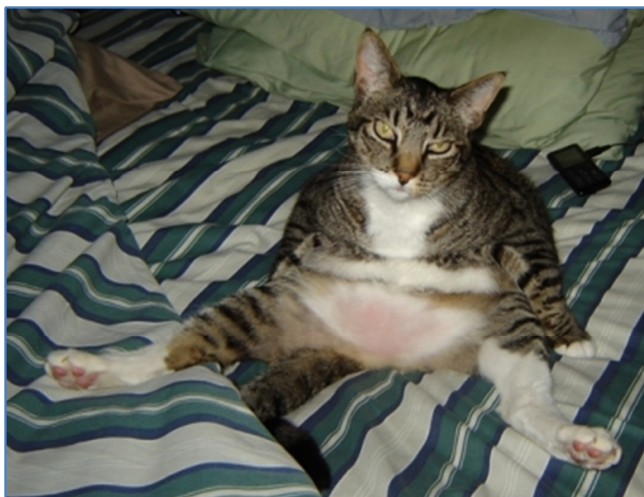

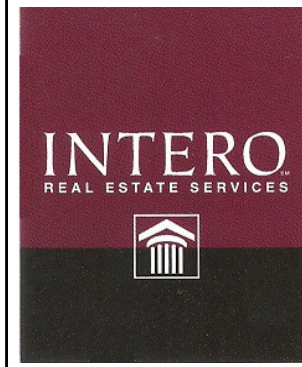
