Brief Summary of February General Meeting Minutes

Guest Speaker: Courtney Hornsby of Reading Partners discussed this volunteer program designed to help students improve their reading proficiency. Four out of five fourth-graders do not read at proficiency levels and, without intervention, these students are four times more likely to drop out of high school. With this program, 90% of the students improved their reading skills. Volunteers are needed to work one-on-one with a student throughout the school year, one hour per week, in a classroom setting Monday-Friday between the hours of 9am-5pm. SNAIL Bylaws: The proposed bylaws were passed by a unanimous vote of the membership with fifteen in favor.

Standing Rules: Kirstin Sims and Valérie Suarès are gathering information to put into our standing rules. These are resources and procedures from prior SNAIL events that will be documented for future use.

Newsletter Advertising: Costs of printing and supplies have increased and we are looking at increasing the cost of advertising in the newsletter. Kirstin prepared a comprehensive document with several approaches to obtaining more funds from advertisers. There was quite a bit of discussion around the various options. The membership voted to charge \$200 for six months and \$390 for twelve months with nine voting in favor, three were opposed and three abstained. This vote affects new advertisers and renewals of current advertisers.

Storage Units: Kirstin investigated the cost of renting storage space for SNAIL event items. It could cost around \$2,400 per year. Jim Quaderer will write an article for the next newsletter to see if anyone is interested in keeping a SNAIL shed in their backyard.

City Grant: John Cordes volunteered to work on the 2016 grant.

Bring the following documents: Social Security card or ITIN for each family member, W-2 forms for all jobs held in 2015 and all 1099 or 1098 forms, child care provider information, landlord's name, address and phone number, voided check for direct deposit, last year's tax return (if you have it) and health insurance statement form 1095-A, 1095-B or 1095-C (if you have it).



Neighborhood Preservation - Did You Know...



Recyclable waste oil which is placed in a designated recycling collection location for collection under the city's waste oil collection program shall be placed in containers not exceeding one gallon in capacity with a screw top lid. Containers shall be maintained so that recyclable waste oil may be contained without leakage.



RECYCLE USED OIL

Recyclable waste oil which is placed in a designated recycling collection location for collection under the city's waste oil collection program shall remain the property of the waste oil generator until such waste oil is collected by the city or city licensed disposal service operator.



Upon the collection of recyclable waste oil, the recyclable waste oil shall become the property of the city licensed disposal service operator, as set forth in the agreement for collection of waste oil between the city and the licensed disposal service operator.

Spring Begins March 20th

Spring traditionally marks the end of Winter and the beginning of a season that signifies longer days and warmer temperatures. The first day of Spring is also known as the Vernal Equinox. This marks the day that the sun's path is directly over the equator. This day also contains equal amounts of day time and night time. This day typically occurs each year on March 20th, and on March 21st in some years.

Facts about Spring

- ➤ In 2016, Spring begins on March 20th.
- The First Day of Spring is also called the Vernal Equinox.
- An equinox is an astronomical event in which the plane of Earth's equator passes through the center of the Sun, making night and day of approximately equal length all over the planet. On the vernal equinox, the Sun crosses the equator into the Northern Hemisphere. This has the effect of making the days longer in the Northern Hemisphere until the Summer Solstice occurs.
- ➤ The Egyptian Great Sphinx of Giza points directly at the Sun on this day.

To celebrate the Spring Equinox (also known as the Vernal Equinox), we will host a plant exchange at Columbia Park on Saturday, March 26th from 10am to 12pm. Bring seedlings, rooted cuttings, or young potted plants to exchange. Find other plants you might like to try growing. Please label the plants with the name of the plant. Those who have no plants to contribute are also welcome to participate. Celebrating the Spring Equinox is a practice that began many thousands of years ago, long before there were religious groups that established holidays close to the Spring Equinox. 


