Cold Weather Shelter



Thanks to the combined efforts of countless community volunteers, Councilmember Jim Davis, the City of Sunnyvale Council members, and Santa Clara County Supervisor Joe Simitian, the Santa Clara North County shelter opened December 1st, 2015 and closed its doors on March 30th, 2016.

Many SNAIL members have been involved serving meals once a week since 2001, delivering warm articles of clothing, cooking meals, baking cookies and contributing their time to make a difference.

This year, SNAIL members volunteered 212 hours, baked 1,800 homemade cookies and poured 75 gallons of milk and juices. During the cold and rainy days, they handed out 100 wool beanies, 200 toiletry kits, 26 fleece blankets, 100 toothbrushes, lip balms, roll on deodorant sticks and pairs of socks for comfort. Not to forget the countless warm little beds and blankets that were handed out to the accompanying pets.

Priceless were the warm smiles, the supporting shoulders, the listening ears and the hot meals offered to everybody walking through the doors. Some of our medically trained volunteers even provided medical assistance as first respondents while waiting for the fire department to arrive at the shelter.

Brief Summary of April General Meeting Minutes

Guest Speaker: Rob Smiley, CEO of the Sunnyvale School District. The November 13th construction bond was passed, enabling many improvements in our Sunnyvale Schools. New housing developments and district capacity are taken into account when developing these school projects. Completed projects include Cherry Chase, Ellis, and Sunnyvale Middle School received technical upgrades comprised of more bands and fiber optic cables. Lakewood Elementary had 26 classrooms modernized. The 30-year old kitchen was replaced and new kindergarten classrooms added. The old portable classrooms have been removed and new storm drains and waste lines installed. Also, new water lines from the nearby Hetch Hetchy lines have replaced the old lines. This led into a discussion of how the school project will affect the three Maude proposals discussed at Bishop School and also, in prior meetings. Don wanted to know who establishes parking restrictions, since parking overflows into the neighborhood. The City does this, not the school. Rob Smiley stated to have truly adequate parking, you have to be land rich, and that is not the case in Sunnyvale.

Social Secretary Report: Tarik represented Bonnie, suggesting we celebrate Cinco de Mayo at the next SNAIL meeting, since it falls on that day. Connie and Denise volunteered to provide hospitality for this event.
