#### **Brief Summary of August General Meeting Minutes**

**Announcements:** Dustyn Bindel, Community Services Coordinator for Columbia Neighborhood Center, would like to become more involved with SNAIL in regards to his work with Columbia School. He was not at the meeting, so this needs to be discussed with him.

National Night Out: There were about a hundred fewer SNAIL attendees this year than last. Other neighborhoods also experienced a reduced attendance this year. The band performed for free and it was suggested that they be reimbursed for their gas since they came from out of the area. Again, many felt the band played too loudly. Dave Cortese and Jim Davis were in attendance as well as a hook and ladder fire truck. Root beer floats were popular this year. It was suggested that the leftover food be donated to the Sunnyvale Community Services or Our Daily Bread. There were a large number of volunteers that made the event clean-up go faster and smoother.

**Standing Rules:** Tarik provided a commentary on the first proposed standing rule, i.e. that SNAIL shall not loan out equipment for use to support an event that is not sponsored by SNAII.

City Report: Regarding the redevelopment of the Civic Center, polling predicted that a bond measure, to pay for remodeling the entire Civic Center at the same time, would fail. Therefore, the City Council directed staff to develop a phase approach instead. The first phase will probably be replacing City Hall. There are substantial design changes for Butcher's Corners. There will be no retail business and a park will be added. There is a new neighborhood association near us. The parameters include Bayview, Arques, Sunnyvale Avenue and Hazelton.

**Other Business:** Since so many people use "Nextdoor.com", it was suggested that we discontinue the SNAILchitchat Yahoo Group and switch to Nextdoor. Discussion at Sept. monthly meeting.

Free Program to Help with Managing Chronic Conditions: Better Choices, Better Health is a 6-week, self-management program for people living with chronic conditions such as high cholesterol, arthritis, diabetics, asthma, depression, obesity, among others. This program also benefits individuals who care for someone living with chronic conditions. Participants will learn: techniques to deal with frustration, fatigue, pain and isolation, appropriate exercise, nutrition, appropriate use of medication and effectively communication skills with health professionals and loved ones. Workshops will be facilitated by trained volunteers from the Health Trust. #### "Sunnyvale's Trees – State of the Urban Forest" and Candidate's Forum

### Leonard Dunn, Urban Landscape Manager Street Tree Services, Parks Division of Sunnyvale

Leonard Dunn and the Sunnyvale Urban Forest Advocates invite you to come and learn about the state of the urban forest in Sunnyvale.

Maybe you've wondered about the trees in Sunnyvale. For example, how many trees do we have altogether in the city? How many street trees are there? What is the overall canopy cover in the city? Is it increasing or decreasing? What types of trees are being planted? Are we changing from the trees that were planted 60 years ago? Where is the oldest tree in the city? How do the trees cope with the drought? Does urban forest just mean trees? These and many other questions will be answered by Leonard Dunn. He will outline the study which was done 2008/2009 of the urban forest in Sunnyvale which resulted in the Urban Forest Management Plan. Many of the above questions are answered in this plan but suggestions were also made as to how to improve the urban forest. Come and learn what you can do to help the urban forest in Sunnyvale!

SUFA has also invited the candidates running for City Council in November to speak on their platform for the urban forest. They will be given equal time to present their ideas and then the audience will be allowed time to ask questions of the candidates. -Deborah Marks, SUFA
