Brief Summary of August General Meeting Minutes

Discussion: Sunnyvale City Green Energy – Local cities such as Palo Alto and Santa Clara are forming their own companies, bypassing PG&E. There is information on the city website and through the quarterly report. You can Opt-out. Don mentioned that the information does not give the dollar amount per KWh and there is no Public Utility Commission oversight. Patsy asked Don if he would report back on his findings. SNAIL may have a guest speaker to provide more information.

City Report: Larry Klein gave some updates to the grade separations. Next public meeting is on August 10th.

- > Fair Oaks Park is being retrofitted to have play areas for children of all abilities.
- ➤ Mary Avenue overpass is still in the Environmental Impact review there are 4 different plans. Final decision by next year.
- ➤ Town Center will have a Whole Foods Market. The contractor is refurbishing the previous construction. Expect 190 housing units by the 3rd quarter. Still questions on whether Macy's will still be an anchor store.
- ➤ Old Signetics plant will be converted to housing. There will be green space through the center of the project. Concerns about toxic chemicals have been addressed through a special barrier system.

National Night Out: Diane reported that we had over 240 participants. No jump house this year due to Sunnyvale's Risk Management policy. Diane typed out a list of information on National Night Out for SNAIL archives. Members gave positive feedback to Diane for a successful National Night Out event.


