The holiday season is here! Pumpkin spice or peppermint spiced latte marketing is in full swing. While this is can be a fun time of the year, there are also so many high calorie and high sugar foods during October (Halloween candy), November (Thanksgiving pies), and December (holiday cookies). Here are my top five tips for having a healthier holiday season!

- ♥ Focus on family and friends enjoy catching up with those you love vs. getting a second helping.
- Fill up on fiber think about covering your plate in a bed of lettuce greens or have a plate of salad before eating mashed potatoes, gravy, stuffing etc.
- ♥ Be the one to bring a non-starchy vegetable or side dish to the festivities, such as garlic cauliflower rice (1 bag cauliflower crumbles, 1 tablespoon oil, 1 tablespoon granulated garlic-add the oil to the pan and then the cauliflower with the garlic and sauté until lightly browned which helps to make the recipe have a rice like consistency).
- Add spices focus on adding cinnamon and reducing the sugar in your recipes or garlic and thyme to meats or lemon zest to broccoli.
- Make time for activity plan a family walk before or after dinner (e.g., take a walk at Columbia Community center or Seven Seas Park).
