




SNAIL Neighborhood Little Free Library Update

Brief Summary of January General Meeting Minutes

Standing Rules – Newsletter Policies: A proposal to adopt a policy for renewing and accepting future advertisers and also a policy for fundraiser and non-profit articles in the newsletter were discussed for consideration as standing rules. A vote was taken and three new standing rules passed unanimously with ten votes:

1. Priority for accepting and reviewing advertising:

- Ads will be accepted or renewed according to the priority stated below and based on available openings as determined by the newsletter editor:
 - 1. SNAIL residents with businesses.
 - 2. SNAIL businesses.
 - 3. Sunnyvale businesses.
- A copy of every SNAIL newsletter is available in the Newsletter Archive on the SNAIL website.

2. Newsletter Advertisement Costs:

- One month for \$35.00
- Six months for \$200 (\$33.33/mo.)
- Twelve months for \$390 (\$32.50/mo.)

3. Non-Profit or Fundraiser Articles:

- Articles must be for organizations or events in Sunnyvale, endorsed by the City of Sunnyvale, <u>or</u>
- Articles must be for organizations or events in Sunnyvale or neighboring cities submitted by SNAIL neighbors associated with those organizations or events.
- Articles will be published based on available space as determined by the newsletter editor.

City Report: The January 8th City Council Meeting will include the final hearing for the Bluebonnet Mobile Home Park. High-density housing is scheduled to replace the park, consisting of sixty luxury units and twelve affordable units.

Business Meeting: John Cordes was unanimously voted in as Treasurer; though some initially volunteered, there have been no confirmations of desirable sites for our yearly yard sale and there is a slim possibility that the school may be available; there are a variety of speakers available through the City and the membership affirmed their desire to hear many of the City speakers this year.

Did you know, on average, someone dies of cardiovascular disease every 40 seconds? That is deaths about 2,200 of cardiovascular disease each day.1 February is a time to focus on keeping our hearts healthy for the rest of the year. Below are some

recommendations to make sure you are focusing on keeping your heart healthy:

- 1. Know your numbers it is important to know your cholesterol, blood pressure and blood glucose (A1c) numbers.
- 2. Discuss your risk factors and lab work with your primary care provider.
- 3. Focus on making small changes to make a lasting change. For example, increase your physical activity or increase your consumption of vegetables.

Think about adding fiber rich foods like beans, vegetables and whole fruit if your primary care provider tells you to lower your cholesterol.
