Brief Summary of February General Meeting Minutes

City Speakers (Tarik): There has been no response yet for City speakers. The City Manager should be asked about available speakers at the Quarterly Meeting.

Yard Sale Venue (Valerie): A location is still needed for the June yard sale. Use of the school would be very expensive, \$90 an hour. This would wipe out our profits. Also, Barry stated the yard sale location must be established before he notifies the City about our dumpster event. April is the deadline. It was suggested a dumpster could be moved to the yard sale site at the end of the day on Saturday. One month before the sale Connie started gathering items at her house. Tarik is doing this now. In the past, Valerie has taken three days off for the yard sale. Friday before the sale, stored items must be moved to the site. The Monday after the sale has been recycle day. Recycle locations are Goodwill, Electronic Recycling, bike recycling, and online advertising. Also considered was hiring day laborers to help with moving large items around.

Candidate Forum: We will coordinate with another organization because John Cordes, a SNAIL member, is running for council. Tarik will ask San Miguel if they wish to participate with us. An idea for a moderator included asking a local reporter to accept this position. Jim Quaderer will be asked to be the time keeper. Someone will ask LinkedIn if we may use their room again.

City Report (Larry Klein, Vice Mayor): Items mentioned were: the City Council's onsite meeting on sustainability, traffic, the reconfiguration of Iowa Street, extending Murphy Avenue to McKinley Avenue, adding green scape around the old Town Center plaza (now called Redwood Square). The developers broke ground on the new Whole Foods and AMC Theaters building on the corner of Sunnyvale and McKinley Avenues.

New Business: Valerie brought up the idea of having a Sunnyvale sign as a landmark, much the way the Del Monte water tank is a landmark. The inconvenient dip on Hemlock was brought up.
