#### HIGHLIGHTS OF SNAIL GENERAL MEETING - JUNE

**July SNAIL Meeting:** The July SNAIL meeting will be at John Cordes and Diane Gleason's house.

**Summit Denali Charter School:** The property being considered is owned by the school, but they don't yet know if they can build on it. On Thursday, June 14<sup>th</sup> there will be a meeting at Larkspur Landing Hotel, 6:00 to 7:00 .pm. There is an ongoing traffic study in progress.

**Candidate Forum:** This will be held in the Fair Oaks Park Building. The president of the League of Women Voters will moderate. We have positive feedback that three small neighborhood associations will attend as well as San Miguel. The questions to be asked will soon be reviewed on SNAIL.org. There will be two 3-1/2 hour planning sessions. A week before the forum there will be a meeting with the moderator. The questions will be reviewed by a group.

**National Night Out:** We received the full grant and it will all go to NNO. Next year we will ask to expand the grant. The apartment building on Fair Oaks and Maude has asked to attend the event. It is very important to document attendance. We will need extra stickers, sign-up sheets and perhaps a floating attendance taker with a clip board.

**Little Free Library Expenses:** The money requested for the LFL expenses is \$314.69. The breakdown for the three libraries is \$115.29, \$67.75, and \$131.45. The motion passed unanimously with eleven votes.

Yard Sale: The cash box has been located and Tarik will get the change and cash needed for the event. Bonnie will provide bags. June will provide food. Four tables will be set up the night before with larger items placed under the table. Large items and plants will be moved out.

#### Sunnyvale School District Has an App!



The Sunnyvale School District App provides password-protected access for parents to see live grade and attendance information, allowing families to stay up to date on student progress at any time, from anywhere. From the app, users can also set their own grade and assignment requirements, a feature which allows

the parent or student to be immediately alerted through a push notification if a student's score or grade drops below that selfselected threshold.
