# HIGHLIGHTS OF SNAIL GENERAL MEETING - JULY

August SNAIL Meeting: The August SNAIL meeting will be at John Cordes and Diane Gleason's house.

Yard Sale: Since this yard sale was smaller than usual, we had all the volunteers that were needed. Even though there was not much truck action, a lot of big items were sold. There were a lot of kids due to a baptism party next door. Their parents eventually came to the sale and we had a lot of returning customers. Four tables were set up altogether. A little over six hundred was made and we netted \$505.70.

National Night Out: Communities have the opportunity to attend City Budget appropriation. During these meetings, the public is invited to make comments and/or recommendations. One of our officers sent council a letter requesting they consider raising the Neighborhood Community Grant funds, which SNAIL will apply fully to NNO. Considering that our events attract people outside our neighborhood, we need to find a way to identify whether attendees are from SNAIL or outside as a reason for asking for more money. It was suggested raffle tickets be given to all those with a name tag at which time we can ask if they are SNAIL residents. Also, distributing newsletters to newcomers seems a good idea. We unanimously voted to pay the band and get raffle tickets and prizes. The amount decided upon was \$500. There will be no jump house because they are not insured.
