Highlights of SNAIL General Meeting – SEPTEMBER

Summit School News: The Planning Commission may not yet give this school the go ahead because of the Physical Education situation. The current middle school buses students to other schools for P.E. and uses the parking lot as well.

NNO Report (Diane): National Night Out went well, though fewer plates were used this year than last (225 this year, 240 last year). The new band was good, there was lots of food, and there were lines for the face painting and other entertainments. The free ice cream truck provided by a local realtor was a big hit.

- ♥ Cosmetics packaging (e.g., lipstick, lip gloss, mascara, eye shadow, foundation, etc.)
- ♥ Cereal bags (the ones that come inside the boxes)
- ♥ Chip / snack bags (foil-lined and plastic)
- ♥ Vitamin bottles and caps
- ♥ Solo cups (#6 rigid plastic cups)

The Sunnyvale Candidates Forum

The SNAIL Candidate Forum took place on Sept. 13th at the Fair Oaks Community Room; 49 participants attended and a total of 52 questions were sent in prior to the event, which were grouped into 17 questions and were asked of candidates by our moderator Elaine Manley, from the League of Women Voters.

Did you know that candidates must run for a particular seat and all Sunnyvale voters get to vote for one candidate for each seat? Did you also know that when a seat has two candidates, and one of those candidates is not able to attend the forum, then, as a Non-Profit organization, we are only able to read a statement from each candidate otherwise it would give one candidate a significant advantage over the other one.

- We had the two candidates for Seat 2: Glenn Hendricks the incumbent and Joshua Grossman.
- We had the two candidates for Seat 3: John Cordes, our very own past SNAIL Chair and Mason Fong, both running for Jim Griffith's seat who termed out.
- For Seat 1, one of the candidates, Henry Alexander, had a previous commitment and was unable to attend so, sadly, according to the election rules, we could not have his opponent and incumbent Gustav Larsson on the panel.

A statement from both candidates was read.

Considering that we did not hear the positions on many issues from the two candidates for Seat 1, I encourage you to attend the Upcoming Candidates Forum and Ballot Measures: All upcoming events start at 7:00 p.m.

New Fee Waiver Application for Youth is Available

Now: The City's Community Services Fee Waiver program has a new funding cycle, Oct. 1, 2018, to Sept. 20, 2019. Once approved, families receive \$234 worth of credit per approved child to help pay for registration fees for activities, camps and classes at the resident rate; option to pay subsidized rates for most activities, camps and classes at CNC; early registration dates for most activities, camps and classes at CNC. Families must meet income eligibility criteria and submit specific documents with an application. Applications are available at CNC, Community Center or on city website.

Strategies to Keep Your Home Safe from Fire

Fire is always in the news, but that seems to particularly be the case lately. There are a lot of routine maintenance tasks that aren't just smart to do for your home, but will also help reduce your risk of having a fire:

- ✓ Clean out the dryer vent duct.
- ✓ Clean out the gutters and make sure the roof is free of debris.
- ✓ Remove shrubs around the air-conditioning unit.
- ✓ Keep fire extinguishers in the home.
- ✓ Remove flammable materials from around the structure.
- ✓ Eliminate wood stacks.
- ✓ Replace wood fencing with nonflammable material.
- ✓ If you have a wooden deck, make sure to clear it of debris, and to regularly clean out any dead vegetation underneath.
- ✓ Secure your home's eaves and vent openings, making sure they are properly screened and maintained.
- ✓ Add fire alarms in your home and replace their battery once a
- ✓ Get a fire extinguisher and learn how to use it. (Visit your nearest firehouse to receive quick tips on how to use them.)
- \checkmark Consider enrolling in the upcoming September 18th CERT Training.







CERT educates individuals about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization and disaster medical operations.
