Meeting Minutes

Highlights of Last Month's SNAIL General Meeting Guest Speaker Judy Pavlik, SMHPA Sunnyvale Mobile Home Park Alliance: This alliance was formed to protect residents' investments and rights and to educate the public about the unique position of being a renter and a mobile home owner. Also, the alliance advocates for members at the state and national level. Unlike single family homes, mortgages are about four percent higher (7-8%). As space rent goes up \$100, home equity goes down \$10,000. Residents are covered under a different part of the Civil Code than other neighborhoods. It is called Mobile Home Residency Law (MRL). MRL law is a specialized practice, just like criminal or corporate law.

National Night Out: The grant application is almost finished. We have until April 12th to submit it. Discussed were expenses for the band and also for kid's activities, including face painting, chalk drawings and maybe a craft like making pre-assembled bird houses.

Dumpster Day (June 8, Barry Boole): Barry will check with the City to verify that the list of what can and cannot be accepted is still up to date. There will be six dumpsters this year. Locations are still being determined based on the volunteers.

Yard Sale: June Valenti has offered to be the volunteer coordinator for the yard sale. A location has not been identified nor the number of days it will take place. June has asked to review the list of tasks necessary to make this event possible. Many volunteers and a location will be needed to make this event a successful one.

City Updates (Gustav Larsson): The 237/Mathilda project is estimated to be completed by mid-2020. The groundbreaking ceremony will be Friday, Mar. 22nd.

The new movie theater and Whole Foods near Target should open by the end of the year as well as more apartments. Some apartments are currently occupied.

The contract for the Maude Avenue bike lanes has been approved. Construction will be May through November. The 'pork chops' on Maude will be taken out because they are a hazard to pedestrians. Summit/Denali School will go through City Council reconsideration on April 23rd. The Council wants to see the parking plan. If accepted, it will be renewed in five years if there are no further issues.

Easter History

Easter commemorates Jesus' resurrection three days after his crucifixion and death. Following his death, he was removed from the cross and hastily buried in a tomb. On Sunday, it was discovered that Jesus' tomb was empty and angels informed onlookers that Jesus had risen. Throughout the next 40 days, Jesus appears to his apostles and disciples before finally ascending to heaven. Easter is the highest and holiest of holidays in the Christian faith. Easter is celebrated on the first Sunday following the first full moon after the spring equinox, usually occurring between March 22nd and April 25th.

Easter Facts

- For many Christian congregations, the first Easter service for the year is the Service of Light. The worship typically starts in darkness on the preceding Saturday night or early Sunday morning. Light is brought into the church with candles to signify hope based on the resurrection. The service culminates with the lighting of a paschal candle, signifying Christ.
- Easter eggs represent new life and also symbolize the shape of Jesus' tomb.
- The colors for Easter are white and gold. Easter lilies are popular decorations in American churches. These white blooms are one of the earliest flowers to bloom in the spring and symbolize beauty, purity, and holiness.
- Easter also signifies the end of Lent, the 40-day period of fasting, preparation and penitence observed by the faithful.
- Easter season starts on Easter Sunday and lasts 40 days until Pentecost. The date for Easter is determined by the moon. Easter is the Sunday after the first full moon of spring.

Easter Top Events and Things to Do

- Go to a children's Easter egg hunt, or hold one of your own. Many churches have them the Saturday before Easter, too.
- Wear some new clothes to church. This is an ancient tradition that goes back to the early church when newly baptized persons were given a white gown to wear on Easter.
- Cook an Easter dinner for family and friends. Traditional entrees include lamb or ham. During Lent, the period leading up to Easter, many Roman Catholics exclude meat from their diet, so Easter is often indulgent on meat.

Turkey Stuffed Bell Peppers

6 bell peppers (with top cut out and seeds washed out)*

1 pound lean ground turkey

1 cup marinara sauce[†]

¼ cup shredded cheese

1 clove garlic

1/2 onion, chopped

1 teaspoon oil

Sauté onion and garlic in oil until translucent. Add ground turkey and cook until done. Microwave bell peppers in 1 inch of water for 5 minutes.

Spoon in the turkey, add enough marinara sauce to cover the meat and top with shredded cheese. Bake at 350° for 15 minutes or until cheese is melted.

*You can also add brown rice or quinoa to the peppers as the first layer.

[†]This recipe is very versatile! You can even add enchilada sauce instead of marinara sauce.
