

#### Highlights of Last Month's SNAIL General Meeting

Guest Speaker, DPS Chief Phan: There is an upcoming program for teens; Youth Leadership Academy, teaches life skills lessons, communication skills and wellness. Also upcoming is a Citizen's Academy for Adults, lasting about eight weeks and offered in the evenings. This program will focus on what it is like to be a Public Safety Officer.

Guest Speaker, Captain Jeff Hunter (Crimes in the Area): Auto burglary is the #1 growing crime in this area, while traffic is the #1 complaint in Sunnyvale. Petty theft, stolen vehicles, vehicle burglary and residential burglary are the most prominent crimes in our neighborhood.

National Night Out: The grant has been submitted. Crafts for the kids attending were discussed as well the possibility of an ice cream truck being available.

Dumpster Day (June 8, Barry Boole): Barry has acquired six dumpster monitors.

#### Snacks for Summer Fun!!!



Time for summer fun! What are healthy snacks to pack for all your adventures? Focus on pairing three things: fiber, protein and carbs.

Examples include: chopped up carrots (fiber) and apples (carbs and fiber) with almond

butter (protein and fat); string cheese (protein), whole grain crackers (fiber and carbs); yogurt (protein and carbs) plus chia seeds and chopped nuts (fiber and fat); chia seed pudding which is 1 cup almond milk and 3 tablespoons chia seeds (fiber and some protein) with a sweetener of choice (carbs) and cinnamon.

Customers are attended to on a first come, first served basis.

Youth Drop-In Gym at CNC: Basketball on Mondays, 7 to 9 p.m., and Fridays, 7 to 10 p.m. Improve your game. Affordable prices (\$.50 residents, \$1 non-residents), middle school and high school students only. Bring school ID.

Drop-In Fitness Room at CNC: Morning hours: Tuesdays and Thursdays from 6:00 – 7:30 a.m.; Wednesdays from 6:30 – 8:00 a.m.; Saturdays from 8:00 - 9:30 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. to noon. Evening hours: Mondays and Thursdays from 6:30 -8:00 p.m., Tuesdays & Wednesdays from 7:30 - 9:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 8:00 - 9:30 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. to noon. Come work out with over 15 fitness machines and free weights. Open to adults, high school students with a signed parent consent form, and middle school students must be accompanied by a parent/guardian. \$1 per session per person. Bring a towel, water and wear athletic shoes.

Tweens & Teens, Register for Teen Fitness Challenge: A 4-week workout and healthy cooking class program for middle and high school students (age 11-18). Participants work out with a personal trainer on Tuesdays and Thursdays and learn delicious, healthy cooking recipes on Wednesdays from 3:00 - 5:00 p.m. from June  $11^{t}$ through July 3<sup>rd</sup>. Registration required; \$20 to register and signed parent consent form. If the youth participates in all sessions with one absence or less, their \$20 registration fee will be returned to them at the end of the program.

Salsa Dance Lessons for Adults: Join other adults, learn to dance salsa and have fun in a class led by a volunteer instructor. Beginner's class is scheduled for Monday evenings. Intermediate/Advanced class is scheduled for Friday evenings from 7:00 - 8:30 p.m. in the Columbia Middle School Multi-Purpose Room. Partners are not required; come alone and meet new friends. Resident fees are \$2 per class; non-resident fees are \$3 per class; cash and adults only.

Sunnyvale Community Services at CNC: Every Wednesday from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m. in Room 9. Sunnyvale residents may be eligible to receive assistance with Public Benefits, Food Programs and Emergency Financial Assistance. Stop by, say "hello" to learn more and ask questions.
