#### HIGHLIGHTS OF LAST MONTH'S SNAIL GENERAL MEETING

**City District Elections:** In June of this year, the city council voted 5 to 2 to put a "6-1 proposal" on the March 2020 ballet. This means that next March voters will vote Yes or No for the "6-1 proposal". If the 6-1 proposal passes, then that is the system that will be used for the November city council election. If the 6-1 fails, then a judge would step in and determine a plan for the November election (a judge could easily declare a 7-district system because we have historically had a 7-member city council, and it would require the fewest changes from our current system).

At the SNAIL meeting there was concern expressed about the 6-1 plan selected by 5 of our city council members, especially since the preference by attendees of the community outreach meetings is for a 7 district system.

#### **BACK-TO-SCHOOL LUNCHES FOR KIDS**



Summer is over, and now the kids are back to school! Start their school year off by having them avoid the lunch line and, instead, packing them with fun, healthy lunches from home! Try involving them in e night before

packing their lunches the night before.

Start with using a portion sized lunch container. Look for ones that are divided into three sections with one larger section and two equal and smaller sections. Get your non-starchy vegetables in the large section, carbs and protein in the smaller sections. Add mini containers for dips to add extra flavor to vegetables. Even if the meal does not fit in the divided container think about keeping the portions the same. Here are some fun, healthy combinations that kids would love:

Whole wheat tortilla with turkey, spinach, bell peppers, and cream cheese to help hold the wrap together, cut into 1 inch pieces in the protein and carbs sections. Add carrot sticks and cucumbers with a dip to the vegetable section. Have chopped up fruit on the side.

English muffin pizza's with cheese, sausage, bell peppers in the protein and carb section and chopped up vegetables for the non-starchy vegetable section.

Brainstorm lunch ideas with your kids and see what you come up with as a family! Finally, don't forget those cooler packs to keep the food safe!
