SCC PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT
GUIDANCE FOR THE GENERAL PUBLIC
TO PROTECT RESIDENTS FROM
CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019

SHELTER IN PLACE ORDER EXTENDED THROUGH MAY 31, 2020

ALL INDIVIDUALS IN THE COUNTY TO CONTINUE SHELTERING AT THEIR PLACE OF RESIDENCE EXCEPT FOR ESSENTIAL NEEDS AND IDENTIFIED OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES IN COMPLIANCE WITH SPECIFIED REQUIREMENTS:

- ♣ CONTINUING TO EXEMPT HOMELESS INDIVIDUALS FROM THE ORDER BUT URGING GOVERNMENT AGENCIES TO PROVIDE THEM SHFLTER:
- REQUIRING ALL BUSINESSES AND RECREATION FACILITIES THAT ARE ALLOWED TO OPERATE TO IMPLEMENT SOCIAL DISTANCING, FACE COVERING, AND CLEANING PROTOCOLS; AND
- DIRECTING ALL BUSINESSES, FACILITY OPERATORS, AND GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES TO CONTINUE THE TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF ALL OTHER OPERATIONS NOT ALLOWED UNDER THIS ORDER

SHOPPING DURING COVID-19

During these unprecedented times, going to the grocery store is something that we want to do quickly and not often. Here are 5 ways to maximize your trip.

- ❖Look at your pantry, fridge and freezer before you go so you know exactly what you need to get, versus what you already
- Plan your meals for the next two weeks, hopefully limiting the number of trips you need to making going forward.
- Ensure your list includes vegetables, proteins, carbohydrates and household supplies.
- If it's a familiar grocery store, try modeling your list off the grocery store layout where you plan to shop. This will help you shop more efficiently and prevent you from wandering in the store buying unnecessary things.
- Think about your storage at home; if you have no freezer space, then buy fresh and canned unsalted vegetables instead of frozen items.

These days, most residents have extra garbage, cardboard and recyclables. Follow these steps to make sure everything goes in the right place:



- ◆Break down and flatten your cardboard. If it won't fit in your cart, tie or tape it together and stack neatly at the curb on pickup day (just like in the picture!)
- Single-family residents can set out up to two extra garbage bags on pickup day. A separate truck will pick up the extra bags and bundled cardboard, so leave them out until collected.
- ♦ You probably have more brown paper bags than you need; a friendly reminder, those go in the paper side of your recycling cart.




