

# 2022 SANTA CLARA COUNTY CIVIL GRAND JURY ANNUAL RECRUITMENT



The Superior Court of California, County of Santa Clara is currently recruiting volunteers for the 2022 Civil Grand Jury. The Civil Grand Jury serves as the county's civil watchdog agency, authorized to inspect audit books, records and financial expenditures of county and city governments, special districts, and school districts, to ensure accountability of public funds.

Applicants must be over 18 and a position on the jury requires a commitment of an average of 25 hour per week. The term lasts for one year and the panel begins on January 3, 2022. Persons interested in applying may obtain an application online

#### HIGHLIGHTS OF LAST MONTH'S SNAIL ZOOM MEETING

- 1. Little Free Library-Eagle Scout Project (Rocco Liu): Rocco presented his project outline to install a Little Free Library in our community for his Boy Scout Eagle Project. He visited the existing libraries and noticed there is an area on Morse and E. Duane Ave. that is not currently covered. Rocco's troop will donate books and he will pay for the library. Rocco expressed a preference for children and teen books. Dorit and Barbara both expressed an interest in having a library installed in their yards.
- **2. Guest Speakers:** What are your topics of interest? Send suggestions and recommendations via an email to Marco Vasquez at <a href="mailto:SNAILvicechair@snail.org">SNAILvicechair@snail.org</a>.
- **3.** Yard Sale Proceeds (Tarik and Barbara): We netted \$1,290. For future yard sales: Hope Services (408-748-2874) will pick up items from community yard sales and are selective as to the quality of the items they take. (No mattresses or baby furniture). Also, lookout for people dropping off large items; if items do not sell and are not of good quality, it is up to SNAIL to dispose of them. Having more volunteers to monitor the store during the day so coordinators can monitor donations would be very helpful.
- 4. Newsletter Discussion: Topics included having a printed version again; frequency; several previous Block Reps who used to deliver on their blocks are no longer available; longer lead time and many volunteers are needed to produce printed newsletters to count, label, bundle and deliver this process increases the time to produce the monthly newsletter.
