The sunlight warms every place it lands, even when the breeze is cool, coming in off the ocean and over the Santa Cruz Range. It's a good time to be outdoors for a while—gardening, walking, or...hanging laundry.

Blouses, shirts, and lingerie are damp and chilled from their cold-water wash. They form a chaotic palette of colors in the laundry basket. But clothespins and clothesline will transform that chaos into a colorful array of waving flags.

No matter the color, each piece of laundry plays with the sunlight. Pillowcases dance (and sometimes twirl) in the breeze. On particularly

warm days, lingerie is ready to be taken in almost as soon as it is hung. Shirts hang at an upside-down attention, awaiting their next call into service. Towels absorb the sun's heat, looking as though they've been starched and ironed.

Maybe this is a good day to change the bedsheets. There is nothing quite like the smell of sheets and pillowcases that have been washed then sun-dried. There's a freshness you can breathe in deeply. The advertising pull of those fragrance-free exclamations on laundry detergent containers has an even greater appeal when the sun's work leaves behind the only fragrance you'll want.

Renewable energy sources are reducing the overall cost of our energy supply. Those who can, might choose to add solar panels to their property now or wait for the energy-delivery companies to provide more power from transformed sunlight, wind, and water. Either way, the day is coming when renewable energy sources will be in common use. Clotheslines? They've been around for a very, very long time! No need to wait for the evolution of our energy infrastructure. Whenever possible, "solar drying" was the method of choice until the latter part of the mid-20th century. In many places, it is still the only option. Drying clothes in sunlight is free. You can't get much more of an energy cost-reduction than that!

But for me, it's the flickering light, the aroma, and the feel of sundried laundry that are most convincing of its goodness. Shake, hang, and notice the way the light plays with the clothes in the breeze. Retrieve, smell, feel, fold, and repeat.


