S'VALE URBAN FOREST ADVOCATES – EDIBLE TREE WALK

On June 25th, SUFA (http://www.sunnyvaletrees.org/) held an "Edible Tree Walk" in the SNAIL Neighborhood. Permaculturist, Kris Jensen, led the walk around six blocks, along Duane and Eaglewood, and identified over 40 different edible and harvestable trees and bushes.

These include, Acacia, Almond, Apple, Apricot, Asian Pear, Avocado, Cactus, Cherry, Cork Oak, Fig, Grafted Fruit Salad Trees, Gooseberry, Grape Vines, Grapefruit, Japanese Maple, Japanese Plum, Juniper, Lemon and Limes, Liquid Amber, Loquat, Magnolia, Mandarin, Mulberry, Nectarine, New Zealand Flax, Olive, Orange, Passion Fruit, Peach, Persimmon, Pear, Plum, Pomegranate, Podocarpus, Quince, Raspberry, Boysenberry, Blackberry, a Strawberry Tree, Black Walnut PLUS Vegetables, Herbs and Edible Flowers.

Our 17 participants then socialized and asked questions over tea and cookies. Let's plant more edible trees! Avocado trees are a great shade and food option, and the more we have, the more fruit will get pollinated.

National Aviation Day commemorates the development of aviation all while seeking to promote and support the industry. In 1939, President Franklin D. Roosevelt proclaimed that National Aviation Day would be observed annually on August 19th, the birthday of Orville Wright.

Orville Wright, the younger of the two legendary Wright Brothers, was an American inventor and pioneer in aviation. Orville and his older brother Wilbur built the world's first successful airplane in 1903. In addition to National Aviation Day, in 1959, President Eisenhower declared December 17th as "Wright Brothers' Day" to commemorate the first flight of the Wright Brothers in a mechanically propelled

NEW LITTLE FREE LIBRARY ON E. ARBOR AVE.



Rocco Liu, a Life Scout from Boy Scouts of America, Troop 466 in Sunnyvale, initially proposed to build and install a Little Free Library (LFL) at Columbia Middle School for his Eagle Scout project in 2021. He researched the best location to add a LFL in the SNAIL neighborhood and his final choice was on the 400 block of East Arbor, at the home of Dorit and Dave Chapman.

Dorit opted to purchase an elegant Bronze Parisian Style Garden Cart Stand and convert it into a Little Free Library. An unconventional idea, with a difficult conversion plan.

Rocco solicited friends and family and created PowerPoint slides to propose his project to the troop master. Next up, the more complex part of this project! How to design two weather tight boxes big enough for the tall books at the lower level, and a bigger box to accommodate all other size books.


The result speaks volumes to Rocco's ingenious ideas as you can see from this picture. There is also a white pullout box for inserted maps showing where all other Little Free Libraries are in the SNAIL and Lowlanders neighborhoods. All visitors are encouraged to take one of these maps and visit all other LFL's in the neighborhood.

Maintaining true environmental values, the unsold books from the SNAIL Annual Yard Sale have made their way to this newest LFL on East Arbor, number seven on the map. MAP OF LFL'S IN SNAIL & LOWLANDERS




WORLD MAP OF LITTLE FREE LIBRARIES




