


#### THE MARCH EQUINOX – FIRST DAY OF SPRING

Register for ShapeUp Sunnyvale, Session 2 (Free Program): The next session is scheduled to begin the week of Feb. 27 and will run for eight weeks. ShapeUp Sunnyvale is an active living and healthier eating program funded by El Camino Healthcare District. Any Sunnyvale resident, individuals or families, interested in getting more active or want to cook healthier meals can register. Once registered, participants can choose one or both components (physical activity and healthier cooking). Choose from a menu of activities through Recreation Services such as aquatics fitness, dance, etc. Healthy cooking involves picking up a pre-packed meal kit weekly from Columbia Neighborhood Center (CNC) or the Community Center and cook the meal at home. There will be a recorded video of a professional caterer making the dish and written recipe with instructions. Registration required; priority given to new participants.

FREE! Youth Drop-In Basketball @ CNC: Fridays, 7:00 – 10:00 PM. Indoor youth drop-in basketball for middle and high school youth. Must have current school ID and signed parent consent form. Bring your own ball. Program will be canceled if no one shows after the first hour.

**Drop-In Fitness Room:** *Monday-Friday,* 3:30-8:00 *PM; Saturday,* 9:00 *AM* -12:00 *PM.* Get active with cardio machines (treadmill, bikes, ellipticals), strength training machines and free weights. Bring water, towel and wear athletic shoes. \$1, Residents only. High school students with signed parent consent waiver. Middle school students are free and must attend with a paying parent/guardian.

**Sunnyvale Community Services:** *Tuesdays, 3:00 – 5:00 PM.* Information and help with food, emergency financial assistance, rental or housing issues/assistance, applying for public assistance programs and legal assistance. No appt. necessary, first come, first served.

**COVID-19 Vaccination and Booster Shots with MayView Clinic:** *Wednesdays,* 5:00 – 6:00 PM in the Morse Conference Room. No appointment needed! Get your COVID-19 initial and booster shots based on CDC guidelines. Please bring your vaccine card if you are receiving a booster.

Free Food Distribution, Family Harvest: The fourth Wednesday, 4:15 -5:15 PM. Families in need of food are invited to register for the Family Harvest Program, a monthly food distribution program. Families drive through the CNC/CMS parking lot (739 Morse Ave.) and volunteers load about 100 pounds of food (dry, can and fresh food) into each car with no contact. The next distribution is scheduled for Wed., Mar.  $22^{nd}$ .

**NEW!** Recreation Scholarship Program: (Formerly Fee Waiver Program). The program cycle is Jan. 1 to Dec. 31, 2023. Applications available now on the city website or at CNC. Sunnyvale families with children aged 17 and younger can apply and, if approved, each child will have a \$500 credit to use towards any recreation activity offered by City of Sunnyvale. Income limits have been increased.

#### **UPDATE: SUNNYVALE FOR EQUITY IN EDUCATION (SEE)**

Sunnyvale for Equity in Education (SEE) has been busy connecting with fellow Sunnyvale residents, students, community leaders, similarly minded advocacy groups, and elected officials. There is a lot of support of our effort to address systemic inequities that have faced our families since the 1981 closure of Sunnyvale High School.

Sunnyvale City Council brought forth a study issue to investigate ways to support transportation for students in North Sunnyvale to get to and from Homestead and Fremont high schools. It was proposed by councilmember Srinivasan and co-sponsored by all six other councilmembers. City staff evaluated it and recommended that it be deferred since there were other shuttle study issues that were already underway, and they might inform the high school shuttle feasibility.

SEE organized an advocacy campaign to prioritize the study issue, DPW 23-06. We wrote and distributed a petition. In three days, we got 100 signatures and were able to persuade council through public comments, face to face meetings, and hours on the phone that they should rank 23-06 #1. Our efforts were successful, and the study issue once recommended for deferral was ranked #1 on February 16, 2023.

We've been meeting with Fremont Union High School District administration and board members. On January 31st, the district conducted a study session on "Feasibility of Opening a New Comprehensive High School Site" including a presentation in which consultants laid out the extensive costs, likely exceeding half a billion dollars to build a new high school in north Sunnyvale. The mayor and three councilmembers attended the meeting, Mayor Klein, Councilmember Mehlinger, and Councilmember Cisneros spoke in support of the importance of exploring new high school options in north Sunnyvale.

#### HIGHLIGHTS OF LAST MONTH'S SNAIL ZOOM MEETING

Guests: Councilmember Richard Mehlinger; Judy Pavlick, Founder of Sunnyvale Mobile Home Park Alliance

#### 1. Councilmember Mehlinger - City Updates:

- Study Issue Borregas Corridor: This is a comprehensive vision redesign to optimize safety for pedestrians and cyclists, not just for school kids, but all using the Bay Trail to Downtown connection. This issue is being deferred by Council, so SNAIL will have to advocate for this issue if they want it done this year. The reason for the deferral is due to a grant from Congressman Khanna and improvements that are happening under that grant, secondly, because of improvements on Borregas that are not part of SNAIL, and thirdly, it looks like the City is getting a \$4 million grant from the state for further improvements, mostly on Morse, Ahwanee, Fair Oaks and Mathilda. Please send letters and advocate at the Feb. 16th City Council Public Comments meeting at 8:00 AM.
- Study Issues Upcoming: Shuttle service for FHS students; Gas-powered leaf blower ban in Sunnyvale due to emissions and noise pollution; Proposed budget modification to \$16K to investigate the next three serious crashes in the City. This is to conduct an engineering investigation to identify what possible mitigations we can find.

#### 2. Sunnyvale for Equity in Education (SEE)

• A community group of over 100 people (and growing daily) are advocating for equity in access and quality of FUHSD schools. The intent of starting SEE was not just for building a new high school in northern Sunnyvale long-term, but to also elect a trustee that represents our area and improve more immediate problems such as insufficient transportation for students traveling far distances to Fremont High School.
