FREE! Youth Drop-In Basketball @ CNC: Fridays, 7:00 – 10:00 PM. Indoor youth drop-in basketball for middle and high school youth. Must have current school ID and signed parent consent form. Bring your own ball. Program will be canceled if no one shows after the first hour.

Drop-In Fitness Room: *Monday-Friday,* 3:30 - 8:00 *PM; Saturday,* 9:00 *AM* - 12:00 *PM.* Get active with cardio machines (treadmill, bikes, ellipticals), strength training machines and free weights. Bring water, a towel and wear athletic shoes. \$1, Residents only. High school students with signed parent consent waiver. Middle school students are free and must attend with a paying parent/guardian.

Sunnyvale Community Services: *Tuesdays, 3:00 – 5:00 PM.* Information and help with food, emergency financial assistance, rental or housing issues/assistance, applying for public assistance programs and legal assistance. No appointment necessary, first come, first served.

COVID-19 Vaccination and Booster Shots with MayView Clinic: *Wednesdays, 5:00 – 6:00 PM in the Morse Conference Room.* No appointment needed! Get your COVID-19 initial and booster shots based on CDC guidelines. Please bring your vaccine card if you are receiving a booster.

Free Food Distribution, Family Harvest: The fourth Wednesday, 4:15 – 5:15 PM. The next distribution is scheduled for Wed, May 24. Families in need of food are invited to register for the Family Harvest Program, a monthly food distribution program. Families drive through the CNC/CMS parking lot (739 Morse Ave.) and volunteers load about 100 pounds of food (dry, can and fresh) into each car with no contact.

Assistance with Recreation Scholarship and Activities Registration: *Mondays, 4:00 – 7:00 PM.* Staff will be available for in-person assistance with the Recreation Scholarship application and registration for City of Sunnyvale recreation activities/camps. Drop-in welcome and staff bilingual in English and Spanish available.

Recreation Scholarship Program: (Formerly Fee Waiver Program). *The program cycle is Jan. 1 to Dec. 31, 2023.* Applications are available now on the city website or at CNC. Sunnyvale families with children aged 17 and younger can apply and, if approved, each child will have a \$500 credit to use towards any recreation activity offered by the City of Sunnyvale. Income limits have been increased.

GREEN RESOURCES FOR SPRING CLEANING

Did you know the City can help you dispose of anything you find while cleaning out your house? There are even special events to help

with certain types of items. If you're decluttering, use the guide below to get rid of just about anything!

- Residents can drop off all sorts of items for no charge at the SMaRT Station. The long list includes lightbulbs, batteries, electronics, paint and one-pound empty propane cylinders.

- Many household items, like cleaning solvents, fertilizer and pool chemicals, are considered hazardous waste. You can get rid of them responsibly at a Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) drop-off event. For times, location and to schedule an appointment, visit HHW.org or call 408-299-7300.

HIGHLIGHTS OF LAST MONTH'S SNAIL ZOOM MEETING

Guests: Eric Stroker, Office of Supervisor Otto Lee; Naomi Nakano-Matsumoto, FUHSD Board Member

1. Eric Stroker - County Updates

- D3 Community Roundtable April 20, 2023 Meeting: County Office of Sustainability, and special guests will be Silicon Valley Clean Energy.
- URJGENT Grant Program 2023: Every year they go through the budget inventory grant process. Supervisor Lee goes through the "URJGENT" (Unhoused-Racial Justice-Green-Equity-Neighborhoods-Transparency) grants. Next Friday is the deadline for the grants. You need to be a 501c3 non-profit and be in good standing with the State to qualify. This is the first step in the budget process.

2. Naomi Nakano-Matsumoto, FUHSD

• Sadly, Roy Rocklin passed away and there is a vacancy in the FUHSD board that, by law, needs to be filled. It was voted to have an appointment instead of a special election as that would cost a couple of million dollars. The application process has been opened and for anyone who is interested, the application is due on April 21st. Naomi highly encourages someone from N. Sunnyvale to apply as we don't currently have representation on the board. If interested, go to the FUHSD.org website and get the application.

3. Encampment Issue on San Aleso

• There has been increased encampment on San Aleso. Currently, the county is offering vouchers for the unhoused to be able to go to a motel on San Aleso and unfortunately, the vouchers are only good for seven nights. So, after seven nights, these people had to leave and many of them set up camp just outside the motel on San Aleso. Richard Mehlinger is aware of the issue and has been in contact with City Staff to achieve a resolution soon. A longer-term solution has been proposed for redevelopment of this area as housing.
