
Dumpster Day: June 10th, 8:00 AM to ~2:00 PM

The City of Sunnyvale *prohibits* the following items in the dumpsters: <u>Any</u> Toxic or Hazardous Items, Fluorescent tubes, Refrigerators, Air Conditioners, <u>Construction</u> debris, Batteries, Chemicals, Fuel or Oil, Business waste, Computers, Paints, Auto parts, Electronics. *Questions? Call Sunnyvale Recycling Center (408)* 730-7262 for proper handling.

Sunnyvale will now be requiring separation of yard trimmings from regular dumpster trash. In addition to SIX (6) dumpsters provided to SNAIL, there will be TWO (2) Yard Trimming Bins. These TWO (2) bins are indicated in the man with a green star. Below are some simple guidelines on bin usage:

DUMPSTERS: ONLY for RESIDENTIAL garbage, large items, cactus, palm, ivy, vines. YARD TRIMMINGS BINS: Branches, leaves, plants. No garbage, rocks, dirt or food.

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR


The summer is taking a long time to shine upon us. Let us hope it will soon arrive, so that the fruit and vegetables can grow.

FREE! Story Times at Magical Bridge Playground: June 9 & 15, 11:00 – 11:30 AM. Sunnyvale Library and others will be hosting Story Times, ideal for age 0-5, at Magical Bridge stage in Fair Oaks Park. All ages welcome.

FREE! Youth Drop-In Basketball @ CNC: *Fridays, 7:00 – 10:00 PM.* Indoor youth drop-in basketball for middle and high school youth. Must have current school ID and signed parent consent form. Bring your own ball. Program will be canceled if no one shows after the first hour.

Drop-In Fitness Room: Monday-Friday, 3:30 - 8:00 PM; Saturday, 9:00 AM - 12:00 PM. Get active with cardio machines (treadmill, bikes, ellipticals), strength training machines and free weights. Bring water, a towel and wear athletic shoes. \$1, Residents only. High school students with signed parent consent waiver. Middle school students are free and must attend with a paying parent/guardian.

Sunnyvale Community Services: *Tuesdays, 3:00 – 5:00 PM.* Information and help with food, emergency financial assistance, rental or housing issues/assistance, applying for public assistance programs and legal assistance. No appointment necessary, first come, first served.

COVID-19 Vaccination and Booster Shots with MayView Clinic: *Wednesdays, 5:00 – 6:00 PM in the Morse Conference Room.* No appointment needed! Get your COVID-19 initial and booster shots based on CDC guidelines. Please bring your vaccine card if you are receiving a booster.

Vaccination Clinic for Children (Ages 3-18) with MayView Clinic: *Wednesdays, 5:00 – 6:00 PM.* Children can get their required vaccinations for school or childcare. Appointments are required, call 650-330-7400 or <u>https://ravenswoodfhn.org/service/immunization-clinic/</u>. Fees – sliding scale based.

Free Food Distribution, Family Harvest: *The fourth Wednesday, 4:15* – *5:15 PM. The next distribution is scheduled for Wed, June 28.* Families in need of food are invited to register for the Family Harvest Program, a monthly food distribution program. Families drive through the CNC/CMS parking lot (739 Morse Ave.) and volunteers load about 100 pounds of food (dry, can and fresh) into each car with no contact. **Assistance with Recreation Scholarship and Activities Registration:** *Mondays, 4:00 – 7:00 PM through June 5.* Staff will be available for inperson assistance with the Recreation Scholarship application and registration for City of Sunnyvale recreation activities/camps. Drop-in welcome and staff bilingual in English and Spanish available.

Recreation Scholarship Program: (Formerly Fee Waiver Program). *The program cycle is Jan. 1 to Dec. 31, 2023.* Applications are available now on the city website or at CNC. Sunnyvale families with children aged 17 and younger can apply and, if approved, each child will have a \$500 credit to use towards any recreation activity offered by the City of Sunnyvale. Income limits have been increased.

FREE! STEM Summer Camp for Girls in July – Register Now. For girls entering 4th & 5th grades in August 2023. Theme – Pet Vet. Investigate cat genetics, examine fish tank environments, build a prosthetic limb for an injured animal, etc. When? One-week camp, July 10-14 or July 17-21 from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM. Where? SEE REPORT: RESULTS ON FUHSD BOARD APPOINTMENT



On Monday, May 8, the Fremont Union High School District Board had the opportunity to appoint a qualified, well supported candidate from North Sunnyvale who has earned the trust of the Latinx school community and who offered the Board a strong connection to our community: Allison Joe.

Allision has worked tirelessly to foster an inclusive and vibrant PTA at San Miguel and has brought the school's ethnically diverse families together. Over 30 SEE members – parents, students, and neighbors from SNAIL, Lakewood, Morse Park, and central Sunnyvale, filled the room to support Allison.

Students told stories of being scared to ride the VTA bus and mothers explained, in Spanish, that they didn't even know they could choose their leaders. There were people present in the boardroom, and even speaking at the podium, who have probably never been in that environment or participated in that process.

After a debate that lasted until nearly midnight, the FUHSD chose to appoint the former Mayor of Cupertino, Rod Sinks, citing his governance experience and impressed by his endorsements from elected officials. In the last 20 years of data, there has never been a FUHSD Trustee who lived north of the Caltrain tracks. There still isn't. While SEE is deeply disappointed in the board's decision, we take heart in knowing that we have made some difference. The district finally provided simultaneous Spanish translation at the meeting, and the Trustees and even other candidates all intentionally included North Sunnyvale in the conversation. SEE looks forward to working with Trustee Sinks.
