



SUNNYVALE FOR EQUITY IN EDUCATION UPDATES



On July 13th, we met with Fremont Union High School District to review responses to concerns brought up at the May 20th Community Meeting on Transportation of High School Youth.

Bus Pass Eligibility and Cost: The district clarified who is eligible for bus passes and if there is cost.

Students north of Central Expressway receive free bus passes regardless of income. Students between Central and El Camino Real receive free bus passes if they qualify for free or reduced lunches. If they don't qualify, they can purchase passes for \$15/month. Students south of El Camino Real can purchase bus passes at full price. Bus passes are \$35/month.

<u>Communication</u>: Communications with families about bus transportation will improve. This includes creating a one-page guideline that describes types of passes offered, eligibility, process for application and pick-up, and VTA resources for route planning. There will be a simplified, district-wide form in Spanish and English to sign up for bus passes. The district will meet with staff at each school to make sure everyone understands and applies the district policy. VTA will attend Freshman Orientation at Fremont HS to provide an overview to students on how to ride the bus, plan routes, etc.

<u>Tardy Policy</u>: The District will try to conduct a pilot program that will excuse students who are tardy because the VTA bus is late. This is complicated, which is why they want to test ways to do it.

<u>VTA Service Update</u>: VTA updates service twice a year in August and December. For the August update, VTA will be changing the bus schedule so it arrives at Fremont five minutes earlier (8:15) to give more buffer time in case of delays. They will convert one of the two extra service buses that they run, into an express-like bus (255) that will run from Lakewood directly to FHS without going through SNAIL and downtown.

Other: Parking passes at Fremont High School will be distributed with some consideration for distance from residence to school and not just student seniority. We discussed a school bus service, safety on buses, students having to walk 20 to 30 minutes to a bus stop, and the challenges with having to get a bus pass monthly vs. an annual pass. There needs to be further discussion with the City of Sunnyvale regarding improved bike/ped infrastructure and the City's shuttle study issue. Trustee Sinks is very interested in pursuing other options to serve Sunnyvale students, especially in extracurricular activity participation.

New Partnerships

On July 14th, Sunnyvale for Equity in Education partnered with Livable Sunnyvale and Sunnyvale Community Services to provide information about education inequity to Spanish-speaking Community Leaders. We joined mentors from Livable Sunnyvale in providing support to those who wanted to speak or write to the school board. On July 18th, the community spoke compellingly to the Board during public comments. After the comments, trustees spent about 20 minutes asking Superintendent Clark about issues that the community brought up: bullying, racism, the discrepancy in academic scores, language barriers, inequitable services, transportation barriers, lack of support for students. SEE is enthusiastic that a broader range of community voices are emerging.

HIGHLIGHTS OF LAST MONTH'S SNAIL ZOOM MEETING

1. Richard Mehlinger, D5 Councilmember

• On Tuesday, July 11th, the city council voted to approve the Moffett Park Specific Plan (MPSP). Moffett Park is the triangle of land north of Hwy 237. Right now, it is all office and industrial. The MPSP will add 20,000 new homes to Moffett Park, as well as 10,000,000 sq. ft. of office space, extensive community benefits, new bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure, new parks and open space. It's going to be an eco-innovation district, so there's going to be a strong emphasis on providing spaces for smaller businesses, startups, maker spaces, that sort of thing.

2. Peggy Brewster, Sunnyvale for Equity in Education

• Peggy gave a presentation last month, and she asked Livable Sunnyvale if we could be a coalition partner with them and they voted us in. We have an exciting opportunity tomorrow at Sunnyvale Community Services. They have community leaders that have gone through a mentoring program with Livable Sunnyvale, and they asked SEE to come and provide some information about education inequity. SEE will do a workshop to prepare those community leaders to speak at a school board or to email the board.
