### PACIFIC AUTISM CENTER FOR EDUCATION (PACE)



Since the Summit School closed its doors a few months back, PACE, (Pacific Autism Center for Education) had been looking at the former Summit School property at 824 San Aleso. They moved in late summer to establish a school there for autistic students. There will be 80

students, ranging in age from 6-22, none of whom will be driving as opposed to the Summit School that had 400 students, many of whom were driving.

On Monday 9/25/23, they had their first official welcome to the neighborhood when someone stole all of their special education adaptive bicycles (eight of them) that were locked up behind the building.

This is about an \$8K loss as the adaptive cycles are very expensive. Unfortunately they were still in the process of installing all of their security cameras, so they did not have any video surveillance that is usable, particularly since the theft focused on dismantling their exterior cameras before executing the theft.

Families drive through the CNC/CMS parking lot (739 Morse Ave.) and volunteers load about 100 pounds of food (dry, can and fresh) into each car with no contact.

# SUNNYVALE FOR EQUITY IN EDUCATION (SEE) and FREMONT UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT (FUHSD) UPDATES



The process of moving the Fremont Union High School District from at-large to trustee area elections is well underway. Sunnyvale for Equity in Education firmly believes that all SNAIL and North Sunnyvale residents should stay informed and engaged in this process of forming trustee areas. There has NEVER been a FUHSD trustee from the zip code of the

former Sunnyvale High School, 94085, nor from anywhere north of us. Since SHS was closed, thousands of students from North Sunnyvale have traveled as many as 6 miles to get to the far-from-neighborhood school we are zoned for, Fremont High School. Moving to trustee area elections will ensure that Sunnyvale is represented on the board of trustees. If we had been represented, perhaps Sunnyvale High School would not have been the school chosen to close in 1981. If we had been represented, perhaps students North of El Camino Real would have had accessible and free VTA bus passes for the past 42 years.

The third public hearing about the Fremont Union High School District (FUHSD) move from at-large to trustee-areas elections was held on Tuesday, October 17<sup>th</sup>. Four preliminary maps prepared by the consultant, Cooperative Strategies, were presented at that meeting. FUHSD has been working with the League of Women Voters Cupertino Sunnyvale to design processes to ensure that district mapping lines are drawn with fairness and transparency. They have solicited applications for a FUHSD community based committee called the Community Trustee Area Districting (CTAD) Community whose function will be to facilitate the process of gathering input and developing maps which will be considered by FUHSD Trustees for elections from 2024 through 2032. The committee's role is to ensure the districts accurately reflect the needs and interests of the people they serve. #### **SNAIL TRAFFIC SAFETY UPDATE**



At the October 10<sup>th</sup> City Council Meeting, FBD Vanguard Construction was awarded a contract for \$3.89M to improve pedestrian and bicycle safety in the SNAIL and San Miguel Neighborhoods, prioritizing active transportation improvements close to the neighborhood schools: Bishop Elementary, San Miguel Elementary, and Columbia Middle School.

The project consists of the installation of curb extensions, high visibility crosswalks, advance yield marking, raised crosswalks, speed feedback signs and HAWK (High-Intensity Activated crosswalk) beacons, an upgraded school path to meet current standards, enhancements to existing bike lanes, and creating new bike routes within SNAIL and San Miguel neighborhoods.

These neighborhood improvements cost an estimated \$6 million, of which \$4.8 million is coming from a state Active Transportation Program grant and \$1.2 million from the city's capital projects funds. State Representative Ro Khanna, whose congressional district includes Sunnyvale, helped secure \$880,000 in federal funding for the project.
