Donate to our Halloween Costume Swap: Oct. 1 – 15. Donate your child's clean, gently used costumes and accessories so they can benefit another child in the community. Two drop off locations - CNC, . M-F, 8 am to 8 pm and Saturday, 9 am to noon. You may need to enter the building from the back (Morse Avenue next to CMS campus) outside of regular business hours; and Sunnyvale Public Library during their operating hours.

FREE! Spooky StoryWalk, Wed., Oct. 30, 4:00 – 6:00 PM at Columbia Park. Stroll through the park and enjoy a featured book. Families are encouraged to wear costumes and bring a treat bag. Enjoy craft trick or treat stations and Halloween safety tips while supplies last.

FREE! Halloween Costume Swap Event - Tues., Oct. 22, 3:30 - 5:00 PM at Columbia Middle School, the two portables next to school library. Pay what you can, suggested \$3 donation/class, no one turned away for lack of payment. **Free childcare for children, ages 4-11 available on Tuesdays & Thursdays from 6:15 – 8:15 PM. Children must be potty independent.**

FREE! Food Distribution, Family Harvest: Families in need of food are invited to register for the Family Harvest Program, a monthly food adistribution program that usually takes place on the *fourth Wednesday, 4:15 – 5:15 PM.* New families will need to register on distribution day. Distribution changed to a Farmer's Market model, participants must park, walk into the parking lot and bring re-usable bags for bulk produce, fruits and a cart for dry and canned goods, eggs, milk, etc. Each family will pick up about 100 lbs. of food. *The next distribution is scheduled for Wed., October 23.*
