Substance Use Prevention Policy Program at the Public Health Department- Matt Savage

Please join us at the SNAIL Neighborhood Association Meeting on January 9 to hear from Matt Savage, Program Manager of the Substance Use Prevention Policy Program at the Public Health Department. Matt will talk about his program, his work in the community, and the increasing concern about emerging products, especially for youth. This includes synthetic cannabis, a substance that is nearly identical to traditional cannabis but is sold widely at retailers outside of regulated cannabis dispensaries. It is not FDA-approved, and testing is not required for sale. A recent study found that 11% of high school students have used this product, and another found that it is easily obtained by youth at local retailers.

Free Flu Vaccine with Mayview Clinic (@ CNC): Wednesdays, 3-5 pm by appt. only. Available now through Dec. 7. For children age 3+ and adults. Call 650-330-7400 for an appt. Don't need to be a patient of Mayview/Ravenswood Health Clinic for this service.

Vaccination Clinic for Children (Ages 3-18) with MayView Clinic. Every Wednesday, 5:00 p.m. - 7:00 p.m. Children can get their required vaccinations for school or childcare. Fees are based on sliding scale. Walk-Ins only, no appointment. Call CNC for more info/ instructions to ensure a successful visit.

Free Legal Clinic (Virtual): Thurs., 11/14, 1:00 - 4:00 PM. In partnership with Asian Law Alliance, consult with an attorney on legal issues in the areas of immigration, housing, public benefits, and family law. Consultations average 30 minutes. This month, consultations will be provided in-person at CNC. Registration required, call CNC to register.

Zumba Class: CMS Multi-Purpose Room. Tues., & Thurs, 6:30 - 7:30 PM. A fitness program that involves cardio and Latin-inspired dance. Adults 18+, high school students (14-17) with signed parent consent, students (age 8 – 13) with parent or guardian present. Pay what you can, suggested \$3 donation/class, no one turned away for lack of payment. Free childcare for children, ages 4-11 available on Tuesdays & Thursdays from 6:15 – 8:15 PM. Children must be potty independent.

Fun-on-the-Run (FOTR) Program: November 25 – 27 from 2-5 PM at Columbia Park. A free program that offers a variety of recreation activities for youth, ages 6-11. Parents/guardians must fill out an emergency card on the first day of participation.

FREE! Food Distribution, Family Harvest: Families in need of food are invited to register for the Family Harvest Program, a monthly food distribution program that usually takes place on the fourth Wednesday, 4:15 - 5:15 PM. New families will need to register on distribution day. Distribution changed to a Farmer's Market model, participants must park, walk into the parking lot and bring re-usable bags for bulk produce, fruits and a cart for dry and canned goods, eggs, milk, etc. Each family will pick up about 100 lbs. of food. The next distribution is scheduled for Wed., November 27.
