#### Parents and Kids Response to April's Parents and Kids letter

I am so happy to see this dialogue starting and I hope others will also speak up. I too am a parent in the neighborhood and struggled with where to send my children to school. All parents want the best for their children, and its difficult choosing a school, especially when all you have to go by are meaningless test scores and "talk" around town, often by people who do not attend or even know the schools.

My husband and I decided to send our children to Bishop Elementary after speaking to the principal, touring the school, talking with teachers there and other parents. And we are SO very pleased with our decision.

Our daughter (now a 1st grader) is absolutely thriving. She is already reading at a 2nd grade level and is at or above grade level in every subject. Above all, she loves school. I admit I had concerns her English language learning peers may receive more attention and guidance than her and possibly slow down her progress, but that has absolutely not been the case. The classes are broken up into groups based on ability for each subject and each group gets plenty of assistance.


The technology at the school is fantastic and makes learning even more fun for the kids. Bishop has four Nationally Board Certified teachers (which is very difficult to get) and two more are in the process of getting certified. I believe we have more nationally board certified teachers than any school in the entire district. I can't say enough about the teachers and they are the biggest reason we love the school so much.

The school isn't perfect, none are. So instead of complaining about the things I didn't like, I decided to get more involved and help make it better. I joined the PTO board last year and am very proud of all of the improvements we have made this year. Such as after school Spanish classes, a Daddy Daughter Dance, a Family Game Night, raising twice as much money this year as last year, better ways to communicate with families, etc.

If people are interested in Bishop, I encourage you to stop by the Open House on May 22nd. There will be a special meeting for incoming parents just before 5:30p in the auditorium. I also encourage parents to join the PTO board. Elections for next year are May 3rd and nominations forms are in the office. ### Brief Summary of SNAIL Meeting Minutes - April 5th Meeting

- Speaker: Leonard Dunn from Public Works City of Sunnyvale. Leonard discussed trees and tree trimming in the neighborhood, Our City Forest and pruning practices
- Speaker: Tamon Norinoto from PG&E Vegetation Management discussed the proactive and reactive roles PG&E has with regard to the trees in the neighborhood. Vegetation Management employees are certified arborists who work closely with Sunnyvale and Our City Forest
- 3. Report on the low income housing project on the Armory site. It was reported that 660 South Fair Oaks units are similar to the ones to be placed at the Armory site. These will be studios and 1 bedrooms. This will be a high density project, with about 45 units per acre. City has approved construction building. Discuss concerns around increased population, impact on local traffic, schools and neighboring environment
- The Rok, dinner night out had a small attendance. However, the food was reported to be good.
- Sunnyvale Centennial Celebration Remind people about the planning meeting at Connie's house on April 18<sup>th</sup>.
