

Rezone Public Hearing

City Council

Tuesday, June 19, 2012 at 7 PM City Hall Council Chambers, 456 W. Olive Ave.

The city is considering rezone a large plot of land at Maude and Mathilda to allow a maximum height of 100 feet!! The plan is to have two new six story office buildings and one four story building. The plan also includes a new five level parking structure! This is an addition to the existing 3 story building. This would be a huge R&D

campus in our SNAIL back yard.

I am very concerned such a large campus within a couple hundred feet of our SNAIL neighborhood would negatively affect our property values. I am concerned the tall buildings would fish bowl our houses and back yards. I am also concerned the tall buildings would cast such a large shadow on our yards, that it might be difficult to grow a garden or turn my sunroom into a shadow room. This is in addition to the obvious concern of traffic, noise, and our neighborhood view.

Please join me on Tuesday, June 19th at the public hearing to express our concern and help protect our neighborhood. *Thank you.*

We had a great year together. Have a fun summer vacation. We look forward to seeing everyone again on first day of school: Wednesday August 22, 2012.


