National Night Out Party a Success



Catalytic Converter Theft within SNAIL Community

In the last month and a half there have been 11 catalytic converters stolen from residences in the northern area of Sunnyvale. Most of these vehicles have been Toyotas, in particular SUV's and pickups, because of the space available to get underneath the vehicle. Thieves use portable power saws to remove the converters in minutes. Below is a list of ways to deter converter thieves;

- Park your vehicle in well-populated, well-lit areas
- Park your vehicle inside a closed, locked garage
- Install conspicuous video surveillance cameras
- Use motion sensor lights in your driveway

- Etching the car's VIN number on the converter will allow recycle centers and police agencies to track down the owners of stolen converters

We need the public's help to report suspicious vehicles and persons in a timely manner. Don't rationalize away your "gut" feelings. If something looks suspicious and doesn't look right, call Public Safety at 408-730-7180. If you see a crime in progress please call 911. Tracy C. Noise concerns from around the neighborhood

Everyone likes a good time, but not at someone else's expense. If your neighbor is throwing a party and it is too loud, here are some items to consider:

- If you know your neighbor, go over to the neighbor's house and ask them to turn down the music
- If you are uncomfortable for any reason, contact the nonemergency number for the Department of Public Safety at (408) 730-7110
- If it is an emergency, dial 911

The City of Sunnyvale offers a free 8-session course in personal preparedness and community emergency response called "Sunnyvale Neighborhoods Actively Prepare, (SNAP.)" The next class is enrolling now and begins on September 13th 2012. Many of us do not want to talk about or even contemplate dis-

Many of us do not want to talk about or even contemplate disasters because it may seem "scary, negative, or depressing" to do so. Fair enough. I sympathize. The media coverage of last year's Japan earthquake is what finally pushed me to "do something" and enroll in the City's SNAP course. Learning what to expect in the event of a large scale disaster, such as a strong earthquake, was an eye-opening experience for me. Emergency services will not be available immediately following a major event – period. We really will need to look after ourselves and each other.

Far from doom and gloom, the SNAP instructors provided a fun and interactive learning environment. I finished the course feeling empowered with knowledge of how to prepare and respond, and had the positive experience of making new friends in my community. Also, we got to put on fireman's boots and take turns operating the hose at the fire station – very cool!

SNAP is a great program, and I encourage all SNAIL neighbors who have Thursday evenings available this fall to sign up for the next class.

Brief Summary of SNAIL Meeting Minutes – August 2nd Meeting

- 1. 9 neighbors + Councilmember Jim Griffith were in attendance.
- Treasurer's report Bonnie is home caring for Malcolm; report skipped this month
- 3. National Night Out party, Aug. 7. Announcers for SNAP and Centennial by Jim Quaderer
 - Logistics of the party planning discussed
- 4. Sunnyvale Centennial Celebration Aug. 25, parade committee report, Connie Cook-Turner.
 - Discuss float mechanics and need for volunteers
- September BBQ, Connie Cook-Turner. Article into Sep. newsletter.
 BBQ on Sept. 16th at Connie's house
 - Budget to be discussed at September SNAIL meeting
- Vote (9 yay, 0 no, 0 abstain): approved reimbursement to Patsy Duke for sample bows: \$83.50/72 bows (two boxes or 36 bows per box).
