
SNAIL January Dinner Night Out



Brief Summary of November Meeting Minutes 13 Neighbors in attendance.

- 13 Neighbors in attendance.
 Connie's feedback on Dinner Night Out, Nov. 10 and the Red
 - Bow Breakfast.
 - a. Very positive response to Dinner Night Out, suggestion made to do more events with dinner and a show.
 - b. Connie made a motion for SNAIL funds to pay \$80.70 for tapes used for the bows. Motion seconded. Motion passed.
- 3. Guest Speaker: David Park, VP of Products for <u>NextDoor.com</u>
 - a. We have 35 SNAIL members on <u>NextDoor.com</u>.
 - b. Discussion over NextDoor having potential advantages over the Yahoo! groups we currently use.
 - <u>NextDoor.com</u> requires that all users verify their address (with three methods of doing so, using verification codes). If someone moves from a neighborhood and <u>NextDoor.com</u> is notified, their profile and account are deleted.
 - MextDoor.com has ways to communicate with users in nearby neighborhoods. They're beginning to interface with city governments.
 - e. Questions asked about security and how much you can control being shown on your profile; David confirmed that you can limit how much information is shown on your profile (e.g., you can limit your exact address being shown). The site set-up and interface is similar to a Facebook feed.

- f. <u>NextDoor.com</u> works in IE8, Mozilla Firefox, and Google Chrome. They intend to develop file storage capabilities for the site in the future.
- g. Anonymous posting is not permitted on <u>NextDoor.com</u>.
 Would-be users who are listed in the Registered Sex Offenders list are not permitted to register on the site. Site moderators respond quickly to conflicts or issues on the site.
- Post Office Box discussion John Cordes makes a motion to be paid for the PO Box renewal, a charge of \$91. Motion seconded. Motion passed.
- 5. Discussion on SNAIL Facebook group.
 - a. Concerns over Facebook's security, questions of whether or not the Facebook group will provide enough of a benefit, use, or positive contribution to SNAIL.
 - Discussion and investigation into Facebook's structure and privacy policies have generated enough concerns to decide not to advance with a Facebook group for SNAIL.
- 6. Treasurer's Report Request was made for funds to buy new checks. Motion passed.
- 7. 2010 US Census information
 - a. SNAIL is tract 509 for the US Census with a population of 7,407 residents.
 - b. The Hispanic population is 47% of SNAIL. SNAIL should try to think of more ways to get better Hispanic involvement.
- Proposal regarding SNAIL representation at City Council meetings.
 - a. John Cordes motions for the ability to attend Sunnyvale City Council meetings and speak to represent the SNAIL organization whenever a majority vote is made on any issue that comes through the meetings. Motion does not pass.
- 9. Proposal for a letter to the city council about banning polystyrene takeout containers.
 - John Cordes motions to submit a letter he has written to the Sunnyvale City Council. The letter represents the SNAIL organization's support toward a ban on polystyrene takeout containers. Motion seconded. Motion passes.
