Message from the Chair

I hope you are having a wonderful summer. I have been gone for a month and it is great to be home again. There is a lot of interest in the new Linked-in HQ being built on the corner of Mathilda and Maude Ave. The 6-story buildings are quite visible to SNAIL residents on Pine Ave and other nearby streets. There was discussion about the impact these buildings, and others planned for Peery Park, will have on SNAIL members at the July meeting. At the August meeting, we will be discussing changes we would like in the approval process for tall buildings with our guest speaker, Ryan Kuchenig. If you want to get more involved, SNAIL formed a new committee to work on how these buildings got approved without more neighborhood involvement. The chair is Dwight Davis.

Our other guest speaker will be Richard Gutierrez. Richard will be talking about home rehabilitation support provided by the city for low income homeowners in SNAIL and the Sunnyvale Housing Element Survey. For more info about the housing survey, go to http://housingelement.insunnyvale.com

Longer term, the city is working on an "Area Specific Plan" for the redevelopment requirements for all of Peery Park commercial buildings. Peery Park includes the area North of Maude to South of US101, East from 237 to Mathilda. Tall LinkedIn Buildings

Facts:

- NO ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT WAS DONE.
- Notices were sent to homes within only 300 feet of the LinkedIn project. That is, most of the west side of Pine Ave. The notices went to at most 13 homes in our area and looked like junk mail.
- City of Sunnyvale discarded the city plan and zoning to allow this project ... all in one meeting. The meeting was on June 19, 2012. The video of the meeting is at this location: http://sunnyvaleca.granicus.com/MediaPlayer.php?view_id=4 &clip_id=924
 - Fast forward to 1 hr. 48 min to see the beginning of the discussion
 - Councilman David Whittum states our neighborhood probably would not see the buildings around 1 hr 49 min
 - o Long recess ends at 2 hr 19 min 56 sec
- After viewing the video, you will see all it takes for the city council to waive the city plan is a flashy building.
- 4,500 cars per day are projected. City is only planning on restriping turn lanes to accommodate the traffic.
- Our neighborhood of single family homes starts within 230 feet of the project and will be impacted with traffic going through our neighborhood streets to avoid Mathilda and Maude. We will have more pollution from the heavy traffic. I am particularly concerned about extra traffic around the elementary school at Maude and Sunnyvale Ave.
- This industrial area is called "Peery Park". The LinkedIn buildings is only the beginning of this development along Mathilda all the way to 101.

Bylaw Changes

During SNAIL's general meeting in April, an ad-hoc committee was formed to consider how SNAIL might incorporate information about on-going committees into the SNAIL bylaws. We came up with some additions to Articles IV and V, which were available at the May general meeting. Then later in May, the same committee met to consider how to add wording to the bylaws to meet the State of California nonprofit recommendations. We incorporated wording suggested by the State of California into Articles II and VII, so that our non-profit status is clear. Copies of the proposed changes were available at the June general meeting, with a vote planned for the July meeting. During the July meeting the proposal was sent back to the committee with some possible revisions, but we have not had time to meet due to vacations. The committee will be meeting to review the suggestions from the July meeting and will bring it back to the September SNAIL meeting for a vote. The proposal will be posted on SNAIL.org after we meet.

Brief Summary of June Meeting Minutes

- 1. A total of 12 neighbors were in attendance (one of them Councilman Pat Meyering). City Council Candidates Tap Merrick (for seat 3) and Andy Frazer (for seat 1) were in attendance.
- 2. There was no speaker.
- 3. Discussion on Jeannie Biddle memorial service: No news; it is difficult to get information.
- 4. Other death announcements: Josie Flannery on July 4th. Robert Hinds on June 11th. Robert Hinds used to be the block rep and red bow elf for Pine Ave.
- 5. June 8th Yard sale report: It was a "happy event". There was a fantastic crew of neighbors helping out. Income was over \$1700.
- 6. Nonprofit committee report: Applications are still being processed.
- 7. National Night Out event is being planned for August.
- 8. City grant status: The City Council approved SNAIL's application for \$1000 for National Night Out expenses this August.
- 9. New LinkedIn headquarters discussion: Several neighbors were quite surprised by how large the buildings are and how close the buildings appear to the homes on Pine Ave. There were discussions on the lack of notice, the rezoning approved by City Council, the placement of the tallest buildings nearest to Mathilda, increased traffic, and other issues. A committee was formed to study details of why this happened and report back at a SNAIL general meeting.
- 10. Changes to Bylaws: Article V, Section 5 sent back to committee for revision.

The program's goal is to assist residents in making informed decisions about their health care insurance.


