# **Community Energy Program**

The County of Santa Clara - Office of Sustainability is promoting the following program:

New programs and rebates are now available for single family homeowners in the Santa Clara County who make energy-efficient home improvements. Eligible improvements include air sealing; duct sealing; attic insulation; high-efficiency furnaces, cooling systems, and water systems; wall insulation; and more. Homeowners can be eligible for incentives from \$1,000 to \$2,500 with an Energy Upgrade California<sup>™</sup> Home Upgrade and incentives from \$1,500 to \$4,500, plus a \$300 home energy assessment rebate, with an Advanced Home Upgrade. In addition, a free Home Upgrade Advisor can provide direct one-to-one assistance to help homeowners through every step of the upgrade. Homeowners can contact a Home Upgrade Advisor by calling 866-878-6008.

#### Peery Park Development Update

A group of SNAIL residents from *Sunnyvale Residents for Preserving and Enhancing Quality Neighborhoods* went to the planning commission meeting on Sept. 9<sup>th</sup>, 2013. They voiced their opinions on future developments at Peery Park. After hearing their concerns, it will be recommended to the city council that all future developments should have a 2,000 feet notification around Peery Park, instead of 300 feet. This would be a huge improvement if approved by the City Council, compared to the notification for the LinkedIn project. However, the city is still planning on allowing development of Peery Park, even though the Environmental Impact Report will not be ready for 9 to 18 months.

On Sept. 5<sup>th</sup>, 2013, a group of developers from J.P. DiNapoli and city planners came to our monthly SNAIL meeting. Peter Larko presented plans for two more buildings near LinkedIn. The buildings will both be near the curb, like LinkedIn. One building will be 70 feet tall right behind Pine Ave and the one closer to the 600 block of Madrone will be 96 feet tall. McDonalds will be moved across the street to San Aleso. The developers have heard the concerns of Sunnyvale Residents for Preserving and Enhancing Quality Neighborhoods and are planning on using software so we can see the street view from your address BEFORE the buildings go up.

I am very concerned about the cumulative effect of all four buildings, not just visually, but the traffic. Not one of the buildings is occupied and the traffic is already bad. In addition, Mountain View is planning on adding one million square feet of office space at Maude and 237. Mountain View extends to the Sunnyvale side of 237 and this office space would be on the Sunnyvale side of 237. To my knowledge, this development is not being considered in the traffic reports.

The next hearing is at city council on Tuesday, Oct. 8<sup>th</sup>, 2013 at 7 p.m. This is a good place to voice your concerns about the 2000 foot notification distance, the traffic, or the visual impact. *Dwight Davis, Pine Ave. DwightADavis @ earthlink . net*

#### **Brief Summary of September Meeting Minutes**

- 23 Neighbors were in attendance including Councilman Pat Meyering. Councilman Jim Davis, Planning Commission member (and City Council candidate) Glen Hendricks, Planning Officer Trudi Ryan, and 5 representatives from JP DiNapoli Company were in attendance. City Council candidate Tap Merrick was in attendance. SNAIL officers John Cordes, Jessica McDole, and Jim Quaderer were in attendance.
- 2. JP Di Napoli presented aerial view maps with superimposed site plans of the two office buildings proposed for the west side of N. Mathilda between Del Rey Ave (McDonalds) and Almanor Ave (Burger King). They are looking for input from neighbors.
- SNAIL Mathilda Development Committee: There are six 8story buildings planned for Moffett Park. For details, go to moffettplace.insunnyvale.com. It was suggested that City notices sent to homes could be improved if they included illustrations of the proposed development as viewed from the address of mailing.
- 4. Discussion: City-wide emergency preparedness drill coming up in October.
- 5. SNAIL Candidate Forum, Sep. 25<sup>th</sup>. Planned for the event.
- November elections for 2014 SNAIL officers: Still no volunteers for 2014 Vice Chair, Secretary, and Treasurer positions. SNAIL cannot continue in 2014 unless three neighbors volunteer.

# <u>Columbia Neighborhood Center Events & Activities</u> COVERED CALIFORNIA – AFFORDABLE CARE ACT INFORMATION

The CNC is providing monthly information sessions on Covered California, the state's marketplace where Californians can access high quality health care at an affordable cost through the federal Affordable Care Act. Individuals and families with income between 139% and 400% of the Federal Poverty Level should qualify for assistance for insurance premiums or out of pocket expenses, depending on specific requirements and income level.

The program provides changes to all health insurance starting January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2014, and citizens will be required to have health insurance starting on that date. Open enrollment in Covered California starts on October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2013, and ends on March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2014. Attendees at information sessions will be informed on ways to sign up, including referrals to certified enrollment counselors.

# IMPORTANT: Enrollment in Covered California is FREE and residents should report to Public Safety any phone calls, email or letters from organizations that claim to help with eligibility and registration for a fee. Scammers have already started taking advantage of people who are not informed about this program.

# RETURN BOOK BIN

The CNC lobby has a Library return book bin, where any SV Library book can be returned. Save yourself a trip across town and drop your books off at CNC during regular business hours (weekdays, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.) or when the lobby is open for evening programs. The return book bin is next to the Library Lending Machine, stocked with books for children up to five years old. A Sunnyvale library card is required to take out a book. CNC staff can issue these during regular business hours.

Fall-related injuries are of a significant concern as we age. One in 3 community-dwelling people 65 and older will experience a fall and for those aged 80 and up, it is 1 in 2.
