City Council Meeting

On Tuesday, August 12th at 7 p.m., a real estate developer is requesting the city council to consider rezoning the commercial property in SNAIL, at 210 W. Ahwanee Ave. [near Borregas] to dense Residential. The meeting will take place at city hall.

SNAIL is a neighborhood of eight single-family homes per acre of land. The property at 210 W. Ahwanee Ave. consists of .41 acre [approx. four-tenths of an acre]. Maintaining the SNAIL level of density would allow about three homes on the land.

The developer seeks to tear down the commercial buildings and construct ten luxury townhomes. This is part of a pattern in Sunnyvale of converting commercial space into dense residential development.

Feel free to come to the August 12th city council meeting at 7:00 p.m. [at City Hall, 456 W. Olive Ave.] and express your opinion about this project.

Brief Summary of July Meeting Minutes

•Announcements: Diane Gleason reported that she had left a message with the City regarding the Fire Truck and Police at NNO.

•Guest Speakers: Dave Pitts and Craig Anderson from the Sunnyvale Department of Public Safety. Dave Pitts passed out two flyers — "Sunnyvale 2013 Year End Summary Report — AMENDED" and "SNAIL Crime Reports July 2013 Thru June 2014." Dave Pitts said these reports are given to the FBI. One more homicide and rape; residential burglaries and auto theft had the biggest jumps. No specific hot crime spots in Sunnyvale. A lot of burglaries are in cars where people leave phones & laptops in plain sight. Gang activity - there are always gangs but it has been quiet. Fireworks — a lot this year; best help in catching them is neighbors calling. Columbia Parking lot on Hemlock — seems to be a lot of people there late at night — if there are curfew signs, call the police. There were still bicycle patrols. John Cordes passed along the public safety website: Nixle.com

•Yard Sale: John Cordes reported the Yard Sale total. Valérie Suarès feels it's a good community event & offered to organize next year (2015). Also discussed how nice it was that Connie Cook-Turner donated her yard & food.

•National Night Out (8/5/2014): Have the permit, band, tables, chairs and food. Was discussed and approved having a face painter, glitter painter & balloon artist for 2 hours each. Also Sharon McKnight reported that two neighbors have signed up to show the projects they do at home.

•Bylaws: Elaine Rowan will bring this up at the August meeting.

•City Grant: Thanks to Elaine Rowan & Jim Quaderer – the City approved \$1000 towards SNAIL's proposals for the NNO and the Red Bows.

•T-Shirts for Volunteers: Sharon McKnight and Valérie Suarès offered to look into this and report back at the September meeting.

•Treasurer Report: Patsy Duke reported on the Wells Fargo account balance.

•Book Exchange: John Cordes mentioned he saw book exchanges on Morse & Central Expressway.

•August/September SNAIL Meetings: Diane Gleason offered to have the August meeting at her house. Elaine will check with June Valenti regarding snacks. Elaine will also confirm with Columbia regarding meeting there in September.

•Neighborhood Building Noise: Barry Boole mentioned the building noise starting early & ends late. John Cordes mentioned they should call the police as this would be a permit issue & a crime if they are not following it.

•SNAIL Cookbooks: Jim Quaderer said we still have about 25-30 to sell & they will be available at NNO.

•Red Bows: Jim Quaderer reported we will need about 600 bows and was voted on and approved unanimously to buy more bows.

•Storage: Discussion on where to store the bows along with other SNAIL items. Also mentioned, most of the SNAIL items are worth a lot less than what the storage fees would be.

All I really need to know about how to live and what to do and how to be I learned in kindergarten. Wisdom was not at the top of the graduate-school mountain, but there in the sandpile at Sunday School. These are the things I learned:

- 1. Share everything.
- 2. Play fair.
- 3. Don't hit people.
- 4. Put things back where you found them.
- 5. Clean up your own mess.
- 6. Don't take things that aren't yours.
- 7. Say you're sorry when you hurt somebody.
- 8. Wash your hands before you eat.
- 9. Flush.
- 10. Warm cookies and cold milk are good for you.
- 11. Live a balanced life learn some and think some and draw and paint and sing and dance and play and work every day some.
- 12. Take a nap every afternoon.
- 13. When you go out into the world, watch out for traffic, hold hands, and stick together.
- 14. Be aware of wonder. Remember the little seed in the Styrofoam cup: The roots go down and the plant goes up and nobody really knows how or why, but we are all like that.
- 15. Goldfish and hamsters and white mice and even the little seed in the Styrofoam cup they all die. So do we.
- 16. And then remember the Dick-and-Jane books and the first word you learned the biggest word of all LOOK.

Everything you need to know is in there somewhere. The Golden Rule and love and basic sanitation. Ecology and politics and equality and sane living.

Take any one of those items and extrapolate it into sophisticated adult terms and apply it to your family life or your work or your government or your world and it holds true and clear and firm. Think what a better world it would be if we all – the whole world – had cookies and milk about three o'clock every afternoon and then lay down with our blankies for a nap. Or if all governments had a basic policy to always put things back where they found them and to clean up their own mess.




