### Summary of SNAIL October General Meeting

- Guest Speaker:** Scott Morton from the Sunnyvale Parks Department discussed the Fair Oaks Park project; design project 2014/2015, construction 2015/2016. Scope of work: replace auxiliary restroom with modular fabricated restrooms, renovate parking lot, athletic field (looking into synthetic grass), water play area, picnic area, replace lighting with LED lights, renovate landscape with an irrigation and pump system, possible dog park and recreating the path. The new Seven Seas nautical theme park is an example of what is being done to renovate parks, e.g. woodchips and rubberized surfacing, play elements throughout the park, use of covers for shade instead of trees which have the possibility of falling. There is an Adopt-a-Park Program to help beautify a park; no financial requirement, any group can do it. After 150 hours of service the City will place a sign with adopted group's name.
- SNAIL Elections for 2015:** John Cordes mentioned elections are coming up for all SNAIL Officers: Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary and Treasurer. Phyllis Freeman volunteered to run for Treasurer.
- Thanksgiving Dinner:** Connie Cook-Turner and her husband will be hosting a Thanksgiving Dinner at Marie Callender's for the neighbors in SNAIL on Sunday, Nov. 23<sup>rd</sup> at 1:00 pm.
- Bylaws:** Working on addendums to bylaws. The next meeting is tentatively set for the third week in November. All SNAIL members are welcome to participate. Contact Elaine Rowan at SNAILvicechair@snail.org
- T-Shirts/Vests/Name Tags:** Sharon reported that they have three designs which were voted on; the design with SNAIL's full name along the SNAIL logo has been approved. Aleecia McDonald volunteered to find vendors and prices; she will report back.
- Sunnyvale Street Trees:** John Cordes discussed the street trees that residents of SNAIL can request to be planted. Residents will need to water, but the City will take care of sidewalks. Contact the City of Sunnyvale for a list of trees.
- SNAIL Speakers:** Jim Quaderer suggested an arborist. John Cordes mentioned a Planning Officer for the December meeting.
- Sunnyvale Growth Discussion:** Discussion on the new buildings in Perry Park and the balance growth profile.
- Cookbooks:** Still have some available for sale.
- New Business:** Discussion on SNAIL being a 501(c)(4) non-profit. Connie Cook-Turner mentioned next year will be SNAIL's 20th Anniversary and we should start planning an event; most likely to take place in the middle of summer.

### Columbia Neighborhood Center (CNC) News

**Yoga:** Tuesdays, 6-6:50 pm in the CNC gym. Free for adults and children aged 9 and up (with a parent or guardian). Bring a mat or towel and wear loose fitting clothes.

**Zumba:** Wednesdays, 7-8 pm; Fridays, 6-7 pm. Cost is \$1.00 per person. Children aged 10 and up can attend with a parent. No childcare available.

**Fitness Room Survey Results:** Many thanks to those who filled out a Fitness Room survey. The results are being analyzed and will be posted soon on the CNC website.

**Drop-in Fitness Room:** Mondays and Thursdays, 6:30-8 pm; Tuesdays, 7:30-9 pm; Saturdays, 8-10 am and 10:30 am to noon. Cost is \$1.00 per person. Middle school students can attend with a parent or guardian, high school students attend with a signed waiver from a parent.

**Drop-in Gym:** For middle and high school students. Indoor soccer, Mondays (7-9 pm) and Saturdays (7-10 pm); Basketball, Fridays (7-10 pm) in the CNC gym. Cost is only 50¢ per visit for Sunnyvale residents and \$1 for non-Sunnyvale residents.

**Family Harvest Program:** Free monthly food distribution for families with a child under 18 living at home and meeting certain income guidelines: maximum household gross monthly income \$2,622 (2 people); \$3,298 (3 people); \$3,975 (4 people). For more information or to complete an application, bring photo ID, proof of monthly income and proof of all children living in the home to CNC.

**Children's Health Insurance Enrollment Assistance:** Now located at the San Miguel Family Resource Center at San Miguel School, Tuesdays to Fridays, 9 am to 4 pm. Call (408) 464-7144 for more information.

**Story Time:** Thursdays in the Columbia School Library, 4-5 pm. Reading, fun and games with one of Sunnyvale's librarians.

**Library Lending Machine:** In the CNC lobby, with books for small children through middle school. You only need a Sunnyvale Library card to use it and CNC staff can provide you with one. Bring identification and proof of residency. Any SV Library book can be returned in the green bin in the lobby.

**Free Legal Clinics:** First Saturday of each month. Get a free 20-30 minute consultation on a variety of legal matters. Next sessions: Nov 1<sup>st</sup> and Dec 6<sup>th</sup>.

### Leaf Blowing Etiquette

Many of you have leaf blowing equipment and this is a friendly reminder regarding leaf blowing etiquette.

1. Leaf blowing is allowed between the hours of 8am and 8pm per Sunnyvale Municipal Code 19.42.030(d).
2. Know your leaf blower's limitations. A leaf blower is not going to move a large amount of leaves quickly, particularly if they are wet. Once you have created a pile of leaves of moderate proportions, turn the leaf blower off and finish by using a yard rake.
3. The leaves that blow into your yard are your responsibility, no matter where the leaves came from. Please dispose of them properly in your yard trimming bin.
4. Do not blow your leaves into the street. It clogs up the sewers and they get wet and slimy and pose a hazard on the street. You could potentially be held responsible if your debris, in the right-of-way, causes any accidents.
5. Be aware that the blowers can create a dust storm. Always observe the direction of the wind when operating the blower and check for open doors and windows, including those of your neighbors. This could create problems for those with asthma and other breathing problems.

I just wanted to bring this topic up to remind everyone to please be considerate when operating your leaf blowing equipment.

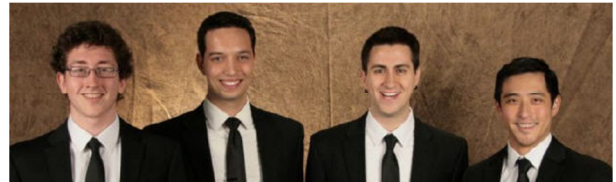

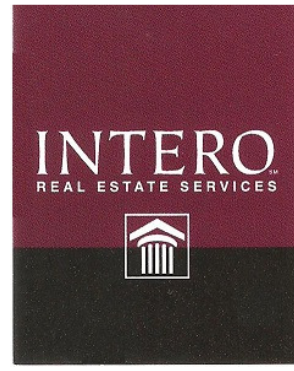
