The newsletters are placed into SPECIAL pouches to be delivered to "distributors" who then deliver newsletter bundles to over 50 block representatives. The block reps then deliver the newsletters to all of the homes on their street. These distribution bags were made by Valérie Suarès, because paper bags were no longer given for free at the grocery stores.

Some programs and classes will not be held in December due to the holiday closure of CNC. Check the information below.

Holiday hours: CNC will be closed 12/24, 12/25, 12/31 and 1/1.

Kindergarten Readiness: Tuesday, 1/20, 6:30-8:30pm in the Sunnyvale Library Program Room. Presented by First 5 Santa Clara County. Free, but registration is required. Learn how to improve a child's classroom success, socialization and adaptation to school using basic building blocks for kindergarten readiness. Yoga: Tuesdays, 6-6:50pm in the CNC gym. Free for adults and children aged 9 and up (with a parent or guardian). No class on 12/23 or 12/30 due to the holidays.

Zumba: Wednesdays, 7-8pm; Fridays, 6-7pm. \$1 per person. Children aged 10 and up can attend with a parent. No class on Dec 12, 24, 26, 31 or January 2.

Drop-in Fitness Room: Mondays and Thursdays, 6:30-8pm; Tuesdays, 7:30-9pm; Saturdays, 8-10am and 10:30am-noon. \$1 per person. Middle school students can attend with a parent or guardian, high school students attend with a signed waiver from a parent. Closed on 12/25, 12/27 and 1/1.

Fitness Room Orientations: Starting in January, a fitness coach will provide a one-hour orientation to the equipment, safety, rules and fitness room etiquette. Registration is required. See the CNC website for dates and times or call (408) 730-7800.

Youth Drop-in Gym: For middle and high school students. Indoor soccer: Mondays, 7-9pm and Saturdays, 7-10pm; Basketball: Fridays, 7-10pm in the CNC gym. Only 50¢ per visit for Sunnyvale residents and \$1 for non-Sunnyvale residents. Closed 12/22, 12/26, 12/27, 12/29 and 1/3.

Family Harvest Program: Free monthly food distribution for families with a child under 18 living at home and meeting certain income guidelines: maximum household gross monthly income \$2,622 (2 people); \$3,298 (3 people); \$3,975 (4 people). For more information or to complete an application, bring photo ID, proof of monthly income and proof of all children living in the home to CNC.

Children's Health Insurance Enrollment Assistance: Tuesdays to Fridays, 9am to 4pm. Located at the San Miguel Family Resource Center at San Miguel School. Call (408) 464-7144 for more information.

Library Lending Machine: Located in the CNC lobby, with books for young children through middle school. You need a Sunnyvale Library card to use it and CNC staff can provide you with one. Bring identification and proof of residency. Any SV Library book can be returned in the green bin in the lobby.

Free Legal Clinics: Held on the first Saturday of each month. Get a free 20-30 minute consultation on a variety of legal matters. Next sessions: 12/6 and 1/3.

Child Care Referrals: Free information packets are available for parents seeking child care, listings of child care providers and tips on evaluating them. Email <u>childcareresources@sunnyvale.ca.gov</u> or call (408) 730-7800.

Summary of November Meeting Minutes

Guest Speaker: Leonard Dunn, Sunnyvale Urban Landscape Manager. The City has 300 trees available for the SNAIL Neighborhood. The LinkedIn developer is funding an upgrade in the SNAIL neighborhood and will put in trees to assist in blocking the view of their buildings. They will also pay to have the City water the trees for up to 3 years. Sunnyvale takes care of the trees, sidewalks and curbs. The City is looking into Mediterranean climate trees, no known bug infestation and drought resistant. There may be up to three choices, but looking at easier maintenance and uniform look. Leonard said they are no longer planting large trees that cause gutter issues and are removing liquid ambers. There are now 28 requests for trees. The City has not directly addressed rentals. Suggested that SNAIL have a campaign and try to have neighbors contact the owners.

Holiday Bows: Distribution coordinator needed along with getting bows from Patsy Duke and April Flowers. Saurabh Singh volunteered. Also need to purchase 300 more for replacement and adding more streets – Elaine Rowan volunteered.

SNAIL Newsletters: Discussion on distribution and areas that need a volunteer block representative. Elaine Rowan mentioned trying to outreach to the kids in the neighborhood again.

SNAIL Funds: Connie Cook-Turner brought up what would happen with SNAIL's funds if it disbanded. Suggest adding something to the Bylaws.

Curb Painting: Discussion on the red curb painting. Three corners of Arbor/Morse done, but one was missed.

New Business: Connie Cook-Turner brought up SNAIL's 20th anniversary next year and suggested an event for next summer. Thomas Leibold mentioned that cars were being broken into at
