Meet our January guest speaker

Matt Savage on the Substance Use Prevention Policy Program at the Public Health Department

Please join us at the SNAIL Neighborhood Association meeting on **January 9th at 7:00 PM** to hear from Matt Savage, Program Manager of the Substance Use Prevention Policy Program at the Public Health Department. Matt will talk about his program, his work in the community, and the increasing concern about emerging products, especially for youth. This includes synthetic cannabis, a substance that is nearly identical to traditional cannabis but is sold widely at retailers outside of regulated cannabis dispensaries. It is not FDA-approved, and testing is not required for sale. A recent study found that 11% of high school students have used this product, and another found that it is easily obtained by youth at local retailers.

- FREE! Monthly Activities at Magical Bridge Playground for All Ages, All Abilities at Fair Oaks Park, 540 N. Fair Oaks Avenue.

Consultations average 30 minutes. This month, consultations will be provided inperson at CNC. Registration required. Call CNC to register.
- Zumba class in CMS Multi-Purpose Room Tues. & Thurs. 6:30– 7:30p.m. Adults 18+, high school students (age 14-17) with signed parent consent, students (age 8–13) with parent or guardian present. Suggested \$3 donation/class, no one turned away for lack of payment. No childcare; children may not wait in the facility.
- FREE! Food Distribution, Family Harvest Wed. Jan. 22 monthly food distribution program that usually takes place on the fourth Wednesday, 4:15–5:15 p.m. New families will need to register on distribution day. A Farmer's Market model; participants must park, walk into the parking lot, and bring reusable bags for bulk produce and fruits, and a cart for dry and canned goods, eggs, milk, and more. Each family will pick up about 100 lbs of food. The next distribution is scheduled for Wed., Jan. 22.
- FREE! Youth Drop-In Basketball in CNC Gym Fridays 7–10pm. Indoor drop-in basketball for middle and high school youth. Must have current school ID and signed parent consent form. Bring your own ball. Program canceled if no one shows after the first hour.
- 2025 Recreation Scholarship Program \$500 scholarship per youth age 17 and under for families that qualify. Must reside in Sunnyvale and meet income criteria. Visit <u>Sunnyvale.ca.gov</u> and search "Recreation Scholarship" for application and details.
- Drop-In Fitness Room Regular hours Tues. & Thurs. 6–8am, Mon. through Fri. 3:30–8pm, Sat. 9am–12pm. Get active with cardio machines (treadmill, bikes, ellipticals), strength training machines, and free weights. Bring water and towel and wear athletic shoes. \$1, residents only. High school students welcome with signed parent consent waiver. Middle school students are free; must attend with a paying parent/guardian. No childcare and children may not wait in the facility.
