If you've passed by the corner of Borregas and E. Maude Avenues, you may have been as excited as I was to notice a new restaurant in town.

**Kurated Kitchens** at 155 E Maude Ave is a new food hall-style neighborhood cafe. It's very much a family owned and operated business. If you've already stopped in for a morning coffee or dined in during the lively lunchtime rush hour, you may have seen chef-restaurateur Brandon Poon and his two brothers Craighton and Clifton behind the counter.

The Poons' vision is to bring multiple culinary concepts under one roof. When you order from a simple touchscreen kiosk (don't worry, you can still order at the counter if prefer), you can browse the menu items they have carefully curated from six restaurant brands, with various options available at different times of day. From a delicious black sesame latte, to a build-your-own vegetarian rice bowl, to a classic hamburger and garlic fries, chances are you'll find something you like.

#### January community meeting highlights

If you missed our last SNAIL meeting, here are a few highlights:

- Matt Savage from the County of Santa Clara Department of Public Health gave a talk titled "Substance Use Prevention Program." His presentation covered how cannabis has changed in the past 30 years. It is much stronger, and more people are using it on a daily basis as it becomes legalized for recreational use. Selfreported youth use in Santa Clara County is 1 in 11. Synthetic cannabis is often more powerful but has not been tested. You have to be 21 years old to purchase it, but there is concern that its marketing appeals to kids. Matt has found least 50 stores in the county selling synthetic cannabis. Listen to youth in your life, ask them questions, and pay attention. Watch for health concerns.
- Chief Phan Ngo from the Sunnyvale Department of Public Safety will be retiring on April 29 and will be missed.
- Our February guest speaker is Anna Mendoza on Access Sunnyvale. Invite your friends and neighbors citywide to attend.
- Richard's updates from the City: The water line work on Maude created a number of trenches that have been patched with temporary asphalt. Pavement rehabilitation project bidding is planned for this spring; construction is planned for late summer.
- Last Tuesday night was the swearing in of incumbent and new members. We now have 3 men and 4 women. We are District 5.



A Farmer's Market model, participants must park, walk into the parking lot, and bring reusable bags for bulk produce and fruits, and a cart for dry and canned goods, eggs, milk, and more. Each family will pick up about 100 lbs. of food.
- FREE! Youth Drop-in Basketball in CNC Gym Fridays, 7-10 pm.
   For middle and high school youth. Must have current school ID and signed parent consent form. Bring your own ball. Program will be canceled if no one shows after the first hour.
- 2025 Recreation Scholarship Program \$500 scholarship per youth, age 17 and under, for families that qualify. Must reside in Sunnyvale and meet income criteria.
